A BIG BOON TO THE FARMERS
Washington, Dec. 5.—One of the laws justly directed against women is the McLean-Weeks bill passed by congress protecting migratory songbirds which are being slaughtered for the milliners' trade.

According to the law which went into effect last month, there will be a closed season of five years on migratory game birds. Migratory insectivorous birds will be protected at all times. Thus the farmers, who have been sufferers from the havoc wrought by the fashions, will once more gain the protection of the birds for their crops, and millions of dollars will be saved to the agricultural world.

The principal regulations of the law are that migratory insectivorous birds are protected at all times; that no bird can be killed between sunset and sunrise; that game and shore birds will come under a closed season for five years and that special protection will be offered for the same number of years to migratory birds passing over certain rivers in certain localities.

The country is divided into breeding zones and wintering zones, and the law is made to safeguard the songsters when protection is most needed. The tariff regulation prohibiting the importation of foreign feathers and skins of wild birds may be regarded by many women as a hardship, but it will serve with the McLean-Weeks bill to revolutionize the milliners' trade and to give by law that protection which women have denied to the feathered denizens of the wilds.

WIFE TO BE BOSS IF SHE WILL END SUIT
Sharon, Pa., Dec. 5.—Myrtle A. Baldwin, of Girard, entered suit for divorce from W. E. Baldwin, and the case took a new turn when the parties came into court and asked that a certain contract be filed and approved, and upon the affirmation of same the plaintiff withdrew her petition.

Give up attentions to another woman not named.
Be good and kind and quit abusing plaintiff.
Refrain from the use of intoxicating liquors.
Plaintiff may choose any position in defendant's store.
Defendant will quit loan business if plaintiff desires.
Plaintiff will fix their place of residence.
Husband must pay court costs.

THE WHIPPING POST UNPOPULAR
IN WASHINGTON—MEMBERS OF CONGRESS DO NOT REGARD IS AS A DETERRENT TO CRIME—DELAWARE A CONVICT LABOR STATE.

Washington, D. C., Dec. 5.—"The news of still another whipping—this time a white man—at the Newcastle county workhouse in Delaware, indicates to me that the whipping post has not the deterrent effect upon crime that is claimed by its supporters," said Representative Evans of Montana, today, discussing the lashing last Saturday of another prisoner.

"Governor Miller of Delaware, in a published interview stated that the whipping post has eliminated the criminal entry from Delaware." In my mail this morning I received a marked copy of a morning newspaper published in Wilmington, Delaware, where the Newcastle workhouse is located, and on a single page of that paper, ten stories of crime appear. Out of a total of thirty-two items on that page, about one-third are stories of crime. "Gunner fires twice in crowd-street;" "Loot summer cottage;" "Accuse two of larceny;" "James Davis, fugitive, killed following attempt to make third attack on negro;" "Girl attacked—two negro boys waylay Miss Anna Underhill;" these are a few of the headlines. The last named outrage occurred within one quarter of a mile of the whipping post itself, notwithstanding the statement made by Representative Brookson of Delaware on the floor of the house that the whipping post was a deterrent to criminals.

"I am confirmed in this belief," continued Mr. Evans, "by Mr. Julian Leavitt, chairman of the prison labor committee of the National Consumers' league, one of the foremost experts in the country, who has recently published two widely read series of articles on prisons and convict labor in the American Magazine and Pearson's Magazine. In Mr. Leavitt's opinion, Delaware is one of the worst of the convict labor states, and is annually contributing an unknown, but certainly large number of criminals to the population of the neighboring states."

The protest of Representative Evans against the whipping post in Delaware has received vigorous endorsement from the National Consumers' League, through the chairman of its prison labor committee, Julian Leavitt.

"I would even go so far as to say, that the U. S. department of justice should have the power to assume control of this institution, as a matter of social sanitation, in precisely the same manner that the U. S. Public Health service takes charge of infected areas where the local authorities are unwilling or unable to exercise proper control," declared Mr. Leavitt today in discussing the matter.

"Delaware clings to the old systems. And these are its by-products: First, it produces unlettered, hopeless, confirmed criminals. The leading industry in this particular prison is the making of boys' knickerbockers for a private concern. Now, outside of prison, this trade, like most needle trades, is largely in the hands of women. This means that the discharged prisoner finds himself without a trade, without means and without friends on the day of his release. Weakened by prison food and indoor confinement, he is unfit to compete with free men, and must revert to crime. Who knows what quota Delaware is contributing to the criminal population of its neighboring states?"

"Second, the Newcastle prison is, like all contract prisons, a hotbed of tuberculosis and other specific diseases. Yet we know, on the basis of official reports, that in the year 1904, and probably in each of the years following, the prisoners turned out 50,000 pairs of boys' knickerbockers all of which were sold outside the state of Delaware. This means that during the last eight years this institution exported nearly a half million of these garments through interstate commerce channels. Who knows how many innocent boys throughout the land fell victims of infections to these goods?"

"Third—many of the prisoners are husbands and fathers. Who is supporting their dependent wives and children? The state of Delaware does nothing for them. What quota does it add thereby to the general burden of prostitution, dependency and crime?"

"These three counts alone prove that the Delaware prison, as organized today, is an interstate nuisance and should be either cleansed or abolished."

Topeka, Dec. 5.—E. P. Ripley, president of the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe railroad, will not oppose government ownership of the railroads as a railroad man, but will fight it as a citizen. Senator Cummins and Senator Kenyon of Iowa, are preparing to introduce a bill for the purchase of the railway systems of the country and Mr. Ripley believes that the country is drifting rapidly toward government ownership. In a prepared statement given out here, President Ripley said: "I do not oppose this policy as a railway officer. I do oppose it, however, as a citizen, because I believe that under our form of government and political conditions it would be the greatest calamity that possibly could befall the American people."

"The government could not acquire the railroads without paying just compensation for them. The roads are now being so regulated that the security owners are not receiving an adequate return, and if they could get their money out they could invest it where it would earn a larger return. Therefore, government ownership might be a blessing to the owners of
