SENDING McNAMARA TO DUNGEON DID HIM GOOD

Warden John E. Hoyle of San Quentin Prison Tells Investigating Committee Convict Said So Himself.

San Francisco, Calif., April 16.—This has been the last thing that ever happened to the convict, who had been sentenced to a life term in the state prison.

These were the words credited to James R. McNamara today by John E. Hoyle of San Quentin penitentiary, during a hearing of the investigating committee.

Hoyle declared McNamara had not been unfairly treated, but had been, on the contrary, allowed to remain unpunished for several infractions of prison rules because Hoyle believed his punishment might be nullified by the court.

Hoyle also said he had evidence connecting McNamara with the case which disturbed prison discipline last June.

POLICE CAPTAINS OF WASHINGTON DENY CHARGES

(By Morning Journal Special Leased Wire.)
Washington, April 16.—Police captains who commanded detachments on Pennsylvania avenue March 30, at the time of the suffragette parade, testified today that the charges of police neglect and inefficiency made by the women marchers.

Six captains, a lieutenant and two sergeants told practically the same story. In their opinion, Major Richard Sylvester, their chief, did everything possible to preserve order and protect the marchers and the officers and men under him did their best to carry out his instructions.

Captain Daly, who commanded a section of the avenue near Seventh street, where the trouble started, suggested that he might have handled the crowd better if some of the mounted police detailed to escort President Wilson from the Union station to his hotel had been detailed instead, along Pennsylvania avenue.

Dr. A. M. Zinkham, an intern from the Emergency hospital, told of being stopped on the avenue while making a run back to the hospital by a man who stepped out of the line of march and waved a gun in his driver's face. He said he learned the next day that it was Senator Poindexter.

The committee expects to hear several officers tomorrow and probably will end the hearing Friday.
