CARBOLIC ACID USED BY WOMAN TO END SORROW

Bertha Woods, or Vestie Ivins, Takes Half a Glass of Corrosive Fluid and Dies on Way to Hospital.

Half an ordinary glass of carbolic acid was used last night by a woman known here as Bertha Woods to end her life.

What the woman's real name was is unknown here, though the local people say it was Vestie Ivins.

The woman drank the acid about 8:30 or 9:15 o'clock, as well as could be determined, the people with whom she was staying knowing nothing of it for some time.

It appeared that she drank about half an ordinary glass of the acid, her tongue, mouth, throat and even her face, being badly burned by it.

The body was taken to Strong brothers undertaking rooms.

Under Sheriff Dick Lewis made an investigation last night. He said the woman's right name was Bertha Ivins.

Her husband lives at Merced street and by father, Frank Ivins, at the same place he was informed. Efforts to reach them by telephone failed.

The woman was about 24 years old, and pretty.

SIX BANDS WILL PLAY STATE FAIR DAILY CONCERTS

Commission Concludes Arrangements to Have Best of Harmony Offered Visitors at Coming Exposition.

Six bands will play the state fair daily concerts, according to Secretary H. W. Wiley, who made arrangements last night that five bands already had been secured in addition to the famous Kiltie's band of Canada.

The bands that will play include, of course, the Kiltie's who will render three concerts a day, the Magellan band, the Civic ladies band, the cadets' band from the state military institute at Roswell, the band that will accompany the detachment of cavalry to the fair, and the local Union school band.

"There will be no lack of harmony any time, anywhere in Albuquerque during fair week," said Secretary Wiley. "We have no need to worry about the schedule of bands we get, but it will be such as to provide for plenty of stated concerts and lots of made whenever it is needed at the fair grounds."

With the Kiltie's come Woe Jamie Clark, pipe major and band leader; J. Carter Lockhart, a Scottish tenor, and Will E. Newlin, conductor. All these men accompanied the band on its tour of the world. All have appeared before the King of England, receiving the Victoria third order for so doing.

The band has toured the world twice. It came here from Kansas City and while Mr. Wiley would not give the exact figures on what it cost to bring the organization here, he said it was more than \$1,500 and less than \$2,000. When Mr. Wiley attempted to secure a week or two's additional booking for the band at other fairs, according to the New Mexico code, they are not allowed to accept, saying that the contract was too steep for them.
