### SUBMARINE SINKS BRITISH TANK STEAMER

Seattle, Wash., Oct. 27.—The British tank steamer, when two days out from Alexandria, Egypt, in the Mediterranean sea, was torpedoed and sunk by a German submarine, according to a cablegram received today by the Pacific Coast company of Seattle, owners of the vessel. No lives were lost, according to the message, which gave no other details.

## BELGIAN WOMAN IS SENTENCED TO DEATH AS SPY

Amsterdam, Oct. 27.—Cécile London, 53 1/2 years of age, daughter of Van der Voort, Belgium, was sentenced to death by a German court martial at Lagny, Monday.

This woman was one of nine persons convicted by the court martial. Seven were Belgians and the others French. Four were sentenced to death and the others were condemned to terms of from ten to fifteen years in prison. The charges against them was of having collected information useful to the French government, for which it was intended.

### BELGIAN WOMEN MAY BE SPARED BY KAISER

Madrid, Oct. 27.—The minister of foreign affairs, announced that he has received information which leads him to believe that death sentences imposed on women in France will be commuted.

Aside from Miss Edith Cavell, the British nurse who was shot recently in Belgium, the names of only five other women who were condemned to death have become known. They are Countess Johanna de Bellechasse, a Belgian, and Miss Louise Chidley, a French school teacher. A dispatch from London on October 22 said Emperor William had notified King Alfonso of Spain that he had pardoned these two women.

### FOUR GERMAN STEAMERS SUNK BY SUBMARINES

London, Oct. 27.—Four German steamers have sunk four more German steamers in the Baltic. This announcement is made in the Russian official statement issued tonight.

## GOVERNMENT ON TRACK OF OTHER CONSPIRATORS

**Ambassador Bernstorff Notices Government That Fay Has No Connection With German Secret Service.**

New York, Oct. 27.—Federal grand jury consideration of the case against the five men charged with conspiring in plotting to destroy trans-Atlantic ships laden with munitions of war for the allies, will begin next month. This was announced today by United States Attorney H. Stanford Marshall after a conference with William J. Flynn, chief of the secret service, and detectives who arrested the men.

After reviewing all the alleged evidence held by the government against the men, Robert E. Walter, U. S. judge, Paul Goetze, Jr., Herbert Knebel and Max Hering, and giving special attention to the confession of Fay—Mr. Marshall said the government was not convinced that those implicated had been strangled.

**May Be Other Arrests.**  
"No more warrants have been issued and no more arrests are contemplated for the present," Marshall said, "but there may be further arrests later. We do not believe that those most responsible for the conspiracy have yet been found. The cases of the men already arrested will go before the November grand jury."

"We have much material gathered as evidence which will have to be digested. One of the acts of the conspiracy was the actual taking of a bomb in a ship for experimental purposes. Our inquiry has not disclosed how this was accomplished and we wish to know how the ship was used and who were the persons who were in it. We do not know whether Fay, who says he was a lieutenant in the German army, was active in a way other than on his own responsibility."

**Bernstorff's Denial.**  
Another development was the sending of a telegram to the state department by Count von Bernstorff, the German ambassador, denying that Fay had any connection with the German secret service or the German government.

Detectives were busy in Westchester and Holbrook, N. J., analyzing explosives and acids alleged to have been used by Fay and Schell, his partner in the case, in connection with the bombing, which, according to Fay's confession, were to be placed on the rudders or propellers of ships, so timed that they would explode after the vessels left New York.
