FEW RECRUITS FOR NAVY ARE SHIPPED HERE

Unless Prospects Brighten Station Will Be Closed in Two Weeks; Four a Week Expected by Department.

The naval recruiting station, which has been here seven weeks, so far has not accepted a single recruit from Albuquerque. It is not the recruiting station's fault. Not one Albuquerque young man, who possessed the physique required by the navy, has come before the recruiting officer, Chief Petty Officer James Saunders.
