WOMAN DIES AT AGE OF 106; SPENT ALL OF LIFE IN COUNTY

Death yesterday afternoon took one of the oldest—perhaps the oldest—woman in territorial country, Mrs. Felita O. de Lacerda, who died at 4 o'clock at her home in Duranes, at the age of 106 years.

Mrs. Lacerda was apparently in good health until the time of death. She ate heartily at noon yesterday and then went to her bed for a nap. She died as she slept. Relatives did not know she was dead until they tried to arouse her. She had not complained of being ill.

Extreme old age did not bring Mrs. Lacerda the infirmities that usually go with long years. Her sight was as good recently as it was many years ago and her hearing remained acute. For many years she worked as a day laborer in the field of retiring not later than 8 o'clock at night and getting up at 4 o'clock in the morning.

Although she was born in old Albuquerque and lived the greater part of her life in Duranes, Mrs. Lacerda never saw a motion picture show, relatives said.

Mr. Lacerda died about seven years ago at an extreme old age. Six sons and four daughters of the couple are living.

The body was taken to Fred Crollot's undertaking rooms. Funeral arrangements had not been made last night.

NEARLY \$2,000 RAISED IN DRIVE FOR C. B. LEAGUE

Only Third of Persons Who Promised to Help Take Part in Campaign; Another Drive to Be Made.

Only a third of the fifty-five who promised to aid in the C. B. League drive for funds worked yesterday. Eighty persons had promised to take part in the drive but only twenty did so. The small force was unable to cover the territory mapped out by the league at the allotted time and another drive will be necessary.

The twenty workers now about one-third of the persons whom the league wished to contribute. The small force made it impossible for any one to go into the Highlands at all. Those who were overlooked will have an opportunity to give to the organization, now. The workers will go out again at a date which had not been decided upon last night. If any one gets tired of waiting for them, he may send his check to Secretary L. P. Reed at the league's office in the city hall.

The workers yesterday raised \$197.75, President A. H. Stroup, president of the league, announced last night. This sum does not represent the whole result of the day's work, however. Persons visited by the workers pledged more than that amount to be paid later. To be exact, \$274.59 was pledged in addition to the \$197.75 in cash collected by the canvassers.

The league, it is estimated, needs \$5,000 to carry on the year's work.

Mr. Stroup said that many probable contributors are yet to be seen. No one who has already given will be asked to increase his gift, said Mr. Stroup.

ARRESTED WHEN HE COMES HERE TO BE MARRIED

Gabriel Savedra, Held for Sheriff of Flagstaff, Ariz., Tells Under Sheriff Reason for Being Here.

Gabriel Savedra, whom Under Sheriff Dick Lewis arrested at the request of Flagstaff, Ariz., officials, told the undersheriff yesterday that he came here to be married. He did not tell the officer the name of his bride-to-be or the time set for their marriage.

Savedra was arrested late Monday afternoon 475-cent street and Central avenue. The undersheriff had been asked by Sheriff Dickinson of Flagstaff to take Savedra into custody and the officer was looking for him. Savedra was one of the first persons to see when he got off the trolley car, coming from the sheriff's office at Old Town.

Undersheriff Lewis was notified by the Arizona sheriff yesterday that a deputy would come from his office for Savedra. The deputy is expected to arrive on Santa Fe train No. 10 this morning. He will take Savedra back to Flagstaff, where he is charged with passing a worthless check, without delay, as the man has waived requisition proceedings.

The court here will not be asked to put into effect the sentence which was passed on Savedra several years ago and suspended, according to Undersheriff Lewis, since he is not charged with committing any offense by New Mexico. Sentence was passed upon him here when he pleaded guilty to passing a bad check.
