Selfish Fifth Avenue Type "An Encumbrance Upon the Earth," She Declares.

STRUT AND USE ROUGE. Average Woman Here, Ignorant of Art and Music, Can Converse Only About Cook.

LONDON, Oct. 10.—Depriving American women and finding an Arcadian simplicity in the opportunities in England to buy bread at a post-office and to hire bicycles at a baker's, Mrs. Anne Warner French, the writer, says she has found out how to live an idyllic life on a modest income.

"I think women at home in New York," she says, "who think of nothing but their own enjoyment, rouging their cheeks, strutting Fifth avenue, wearing costly gowns and winning the envy of less fortunate fellow creatures, are an encumbrance on the earth. I cannot imagine how women can go through such aimless lives without ever having had babies to care for or daily duties to perform.

SHOT DEAD ON STREET.

Two Bandits Fire Five Bullets in Strange Encounter at White Plains. (Special to The Evening World.) WHITE PLAINS, Oct. 10.—A man about twenty-four years old was shot early today in Madison avenue, two men accosted him, exchanged a few words, pulled revolvers simultaneously and began to shoot. The attacked man turned to run, but three of the five shots struck him in the back. One of these came out through his mouth. He staggered to a rear yard and fell dead. The two men who shot him ran away. They have not been arrested. The dead man is unknown here. A label on his black doublet bore the mark of the J. R. Barnaby Co., Providence, R. I. He wore a brown suit and shoes of a fair quality.
