

280 TO HUGHES; 154 TO WILSON; 97 IN BALANCE

Countrywide Canvass Without Bias Shows Republican Victory.

THREE MORE STATES SWINGING TO G. O. P.

Ohio, West Virginia and Wisconsin, Doubtful Early, Seem Safe Now.

MINNESOTA SHOWS REMARKABLE TREND

Gains for Republicans in Both Houses of Congress Are Indicated.

The Sun herewith presents a summary of political conditions in all the States on the eve of election with the best possible forecast which can be made with regard to each at this time.

The subjoined reports represent the views of impartial and competent correspondents and are presented without bias.

On the face of these reports Mr. Hughes would appear to have the better of it. The States which seem to be pretty surely in the Republican column have a total electoral vote of 269. Against this Mr. Wilson would seem to be sure of only 104 votes.

The States which are decidedly doubtful from these reports are Ohio, Washington, West Virginia, Wisconsin, Colorado, Kentucky, Missouri and Nebraska. These States have a total vote of 27. Should Mr. Wilson carry them all he would still lack 15 votes of the necessary 270.

But the indications are that some of these States will go Republican. Ohio is one where the chances seem to favor the Republicans, a turn in sentiment being observed there recently. This is true also of West Virginia and Wisconsin. Missouri and Kentucky look like an even break from these reports.

Following are the summaries of conditions:

Alabama Twelve for Wilson. Alabama, with its twelve votes, may simply be taken for granted.

Arizona G. O. P. Victory Likely in Arizona. Arizona is sometimes classed as a doubtful State, but the recent reports from there say that if it still may be classed as doubtful it has Democratic leanings so pronounced as to make a Republican victory rather a possibility.

California Safe for Hughes. Republicans claim never to have been much concerned about California.

Colorado Sentiment Unchanged. Latest reports from Colorado reveal no change in sentiment there.

Connecticut Clearly Surely Republican. Connecticut is accounted to follow G. O. P. majorities from 18,000 to 30,000.

Delaware A peculiar fight in Delaware. There are two Republican tickets and one Democratic ticket in the field for United States Senator.

Florida Certain for Wilson. Florida is certain for Wilson with its six electoral votes.

Georgia Also Democratic. Georgia, likewise, will go for Wilson and will return a full delegation of twelve Democrats to Congress.

Illinois Women in First Vote. Illinois, whose twenty-nine votes may be counted as a matter of course, has a peculiar feature in the fact that the women will vote for the first time in a Presidential election.

Indiana in Republican Column. Indiana, always a doubtful State but more frequently Republican in recent national elections, appears about to go Republican again.

Iowa Two, May Count on Iowa. Iowa has been so safely Republican since the memory of man runs that no one thought of a Republican ticket.

Kansas Seems Safe for Hughes. Kansas, like Illinois, has the problem of the women's vote this year, but there is such a conviction among the Republicans and Progressives that the State is safe for Hughes.

Kentucky Vote Safe for Wilson. Kentucky has been allotted to the Democrats by several Republican correspondents, but they continue to assert they have a chance of winning the State.

Louisiana Wins Louisiana Again. Louisiana, the home of John M. Parker, Progressive candidate for the Vice Presidency, will elect a Governor and other State officers.

Maine Has Spoken for Hughes. Maine votes only for President and is classed as surely Republican.

Maryland in Doubt; Favors Wilson. Republicans and Democrats have been making a hard contest for Maryland.

Massachusetts Solid for G. O. P. Massachusetts is another of which Hughes is assured.

Michigan Claimed for Hughes. Recent reports from Michigan are somewhat better for the Republicans.

Minnesota Leaning Toward Hughes. Minnesota, usually strongly Republican, as an election draws near remains in the doubtful column.

Missouri In Doubt. Missouri is one of those States where the Republican ticket will be elected, but not by a large margin.

How to Vote the Republican Ticket for President and State Officers.

To vote for Charles E. Hughes mark a cross in the circle under the eagle, as shown below. This insures a vote for each of the Hughes electors. Do not put an X at the left of the name of each elector. To vote for the Republican candidates on the State and local ticket mark an X at the left of the first name printed for each office.

For Justices of the Supreme Court put an X at the left of the first three names. A straight State ticket cannot be voted by a single X mark.

How to Vote the Republican Ticket for President and State Officers. Visual instructions showing how to mark an X on a ballot for various offices like GOVERNOR, ATTORNEY GENERAL, etc.

Presidency will maintain its adherence unflinchingly to Democratic principles and will contribute 10 electoral votes to Mr. Wilson, besides sending a Democratic delegation to Congress.

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Montana's Choice is Doubtful. Montana is doubtful, with chances favoring Wilson. The result depends largely upon the vote of the copper lead.

New Hampshire for Hughes. New Hampshire is counted as surely for Hughes.

New Jersey to Repudiate Wilson. Republicans assert Wilson's own State of New Jersey is about to give Hughes.

New Mexico for G. O. P. Nonleague. Disquiet with Wilson's Mexican policies is expected to give New Mexico electoral votes to Hughes.

New York Situation Interesting. The situation in New York State is interesting in that it is expected to turn in a majority for Hughes.

North Carolina is Democratic. Although North Carolina is one of the "Solid South" she has a Republican Congressman in Washington.

North Dakota Safe Republican. The Republican State ticket of North Dakota was nominated by an organization of farmers and is practically without opposition.

Ohio Safe for Hughes. Ohio is one where the chances seem to favor the Republicans.

Oklahoma will go Democratic. Oklahoma will go for Wilson. The State will elect eight Congressmen and minor State officials.

Oregon is Keen for Hughes. Oregon is decidedly strong in Oregon on the eve of election.

Pennsylvania Loyal to G. O. P. Pennsylvania is counted on to cast her 23 electoral votes for Hughes this year.

Rhode Island Still Republican. Rhode Island appears safe for Hughes. The State likes the principles of the Republican party.

South Carolina Won't Change. South Carolina hardly knows there is a Republican party in existence.

South Dakota G. O. P.'s by 20,000. South Dakota is a State of farms and ranches. The former vote is quite generally Republican.

Tennessee May Be Republican. There have been some assertions made that Tennessee stands a good chance of going Republican.

Texas Democratic All Over. Texas will be Democratic in her national, Congressional and State elections.

Vermont Decidedly for Hughes. Vermont is probably the most intensely Republican State in the Union.

Virginia's Twelve for Wilson. Virginia will turn its twelve electoral votes to Wilson.

Washington State Doubtful. Washington, on the basis of latest reports, is for Hughes, but it is not as yet decided.

West Virginia Uncertain, Too. Based on their activities on the belt that West Virginia is truly in the doubtful column.

Wisconsin Both Sides Claim Wisconsin. Wisconsin is one of the States which both sides claim.

Wyoming Conceded to Hughes. It is not much of a contest for the electoral vote of Wyoming.
