Kramer Breaks 10,000 Metre Record at the Olympic Tryouts

Reynolds of Irish-American A. C. Wins Marathon Under Wretched Conditions.

DESPITE the unfavorable weather conditions and the muddy track, W. J. Kramer of the Long Island Athletic Club won the 10,000-metre run in 22 minutes 12.4 seconds, breaking the American record, at the New York Olympic tryouts, held under the auspices of the Irish-American A. C. at Coney Park.

Another World's Record Broken; Shrubbs' New Mark for 12 Miles

Alfred Shrubbs, the wonderful English professional runner, who was thought to be all in as a result of his long experience in the harrier's game, broke the world's record for the twelve-mile run in a race at Springfield, Mass., covering the distance in 60 minutes 30 seconds.

State Intercollegiate Athletic Union records were broken, as Colgate lowered the mark in the mile run to 4:20.1, a mark of a record faster than the former record, made in 1908 by Clarence of Hamilton. With the famous Williamson of Colgate, the intercollegiate record is 1:20.1. The old record was 1:25.1, made in 1909 by Goodell of Rochester.
