

PUBLIC EDUCATED BY LORENZ CLINICS

Publicity Attending Them Results in Treatment for Many Persons Needlessly Deformed.

Health Department doctors to-day again examined seventy-five patients in the preliminary examination for the next Lorenz clinic for cripples at the Department of Health Building, No. 555 Pearl Street, Friday morning. The patients began arriving before 6 o'clock for the 10 o'clock examinations. Virtually all of them were the children of foreign-born parents.

"Although we have had many patients whose parents are native born," said Dr. Jacob Sobel, Assistant Director of the Bureau of Child Hygiene, "the majority of them are the children of the foreign-born. We see them here most, I think, because the parents, not wholly familiar with the opportunities they've always had for adequate treatment in city hospitals, have delayed having their children treated and have been awakened through the visit of Dr. Lorenz to the necessity as well as the opportunity to do something. These examinations will do a lot toward helping others through making thousands familiar with the services rendered by city institutions."

Dr. Lorenz, who spent the Christmas week-end with friends on Long Island, returned to the city to-day. He will hold his usual Wednesday clinic at Brooklyn to-morrow.

THREE BLAMED FOR THEATRE DEATHS

New Haven Coroner Holds Building Inspector and Theatre Heads Criminally Responsible.

NEW HAVEN, Dec. 27.—City Building Inspector Joseph E. Austin, Lawrence E. Carroll, manager of the theatre, and Alfred S. Black, President of the Connecticut Theatres Corporation which controlled the theatre, are held criminally responsible for the deaths of nine persons in the Rialto Theatre fire of Nov. 27, in finding by Coroner Eli Mix to-day.

MRS. GEORGE W. ELKINS WEDS SAMUEL ROTAN

Capitalist's Widow, Worth \$300,000, Marries His Lawyer.

CINCINNATI, Dec. 27.—Announcement was received in Covington to-day of the marriage of Mrs. Alice Ludlow Elkins, widow of George W. Elkins, to Samuel Rotan, a leading attorney of Philadelphia, the ceremony taking place at noon yesterday at Mrs. Elkins' southern home, Holly Farms, near Savannah, Ga.

Mrs. Elkins is a niece of Mrs. Henry C. Bruce of Covington, and is well known in social circles in Cincinnati. Mr. Rotan was Mr. Elkins' counsel and was closely associated with the capitalist in many of the vast financial enterprises with which he was connected.

Mrs. Elkins was married to Mr. Elkins June 19, 1917. Mr. Elkins died on Oct. 23, 1919. The widow inherited a fortune estimated at nearly \$20,000,000.


