

PROBST MADE LOVE TO ALL CLUB GIRLS, MRS. MELLON SAYS

Ridicules Butler's Story and Asserts He Sought to Win All Women.

SAN FRANCISCO, March 23.—August Probst, former butler at the exclusive Rolling Rock Club near Pittsburgh, who charged that he was a victim of a deportation conspiracy because a young heiress lost her heart to him, "always wanted to make love to every woman at the club," according to Mrs. Richard B. Mellon, who arrived in San Francisco yesterday.

Mrs. Mellon, wife of a Pittsburgh financier and sister-in-law to Secretary of the Treasury Mellon, ridiculed Probst's assertion that she had advised him to return to Switzerland on account of the romance said to have existed between the butler and Miss Virginia C. McKay, Pittsburgh heiress.

Mrs. Mellon to-day said Probst's story was "silly, trivial and ridiculous."

"I have no recollection of ever speaking to Probst except as a servant who occasionally waited on us at the club," said Mrs. Mellon. "Of course I knew him as did all members."

"The story is ridiculous on the face of it. I know that my daughter was not mixed up in it and I am certain that Miss McKay is absolutely blameless."

Mrs. Mellon's daughter, Miss Sara C. Mellon, was said by Probst to have enjoyed the confidence of Miss McKay in regard to the affection the butler said existed between the heiress and himself.

SHOW "ANGEL" HELD FOR 40 BURGLARIES

Value of Loot Stolen Since November Is \$500,000, Detective Declares.

Miles Boucher of No. 162 West 65th Street, who is alleged to have committed at least forty burglaries in order to finance a burlesque show, was held in \$5,000 bail for burglary and \$2,000 more under the Sullivan law at his arraignment to-day in the Yorkville Court.

Detective Muller said the value of the jewels and other property stolen by Boucher since last November is about \$500,000. The prisoner has helped clear up forty burglaries and may help in some others, the police say.

The specific complaint on which Boucher was held to-day was made by Dr. P. M. Barker of No. 290 Park Avenue, where jewels worth \$12,000 were reported stolen. In that place one small safe in a mahogany desk was proof against the efforts of the burglar, who attached to its door the little page of a pamphlet headed "Amateur."

NO BONES ARE BROKEN BUT GIRL CAN'T STAND

Strange Affliction of Jersey Student, Struck by Auto.

Miss Dorothy Delta, of Freneau, a

student at the Normal School, in Newark, today was suffering from injuries that have puzzled attending physicians.

She was struck near her home Tuesday night by an automobile driven by the Rev. Harry Meyer, of Whiteville, and while she was bruised about the body, doctors found no broken bones. Since the accident, however, she has been unable to stand and the doctors are at a loss to account for her condition.

Miss Delta's family has exonerated Meyer from all blame, as the point where the accident occurred was not well lighted.

SOLDIER TUBERCULOSIS HOSPITALS TO BE CLOSED

Some of 15 Institutions at Saranac Lake Doomed.

WASHINGTON, March 23.—A portion of the Tuberculosis Veterans' Hospital at Saranac Lake, N. Y., will be closed down, Col. Forbes of the Veterans' Bureau, announced here to-day.

Some of the fifteen hospitals there have been found unsuitable because they do not offer sufficient facilities for medical treatment, Forbes said.
