STATE RECRUITING PLANS.

GOV. BLACK'S ORDERS FOR RAISING THREE NEW REGIMENTS.

Recruiting Stations to Be Opened in New York, Buffalo, and Syracuse—National Guardsmen Urged to Remain Within the State—The Recruiting Campaign Not Yet Assailed.

ALBANY, June 27.—Gov. Black's plan for recruiting the three infantry regiments to fill the balance of this State's quota under the second call was announced to-day in an order issued by Adj. Gen. Tillingham.

The first preference will be given to individual members of the National Guard, although it is the strong wish and desire of the Commander-in-Chief that National Guardsmen shall not leave the State, but remain here to keep intact their respective organizations for the very honorable task of home defense.

After acceptance by the United States surgeons the men will be quartered and subsisted by the State until mustered into the service of the United States, and will be dropped from the rolls of their respective organizations upon removal, &c.
