BILL MASON'S ROBBERIES.

THE CLEVER PIECE OF WORK BY THE WASHINGTON POLICE FORCE.

They Fasten on Mason the Many Robberies Committed in Washington Last Spring and Recover \$700 or \$800 Worth of the Property in Brooklyn and Elsewhere.

Washington, Aug. 7.—The cleverest piece of detective work by Washington police since the capture of "Jack the Ripper" about four years ago, who, by the way, was caught by a milkman, was accomplished last week when the detectives fastened on the notorious Bill Mason the robberies committed in this city last spring.

Incidentally they have arrested one Johnnie Butts, another secretary, Lyle Dennis, on a charge of being accomplices of Mason. Butts' arrest was made because he sold to Lewis Kaufman of 620 Eighth street Northwest a diamond weighing 2 1/2 carats for \$80.

The arrest of the Dennis woman was made because she was found with Butts when he was arrested. She was supposed to have been mixed up in the robberies which occurred six months ago. Kaufman was arrested yesterday on the charge of receiving stolen goods.

He has been released on \$400 bonds, and the woman will probably be released, as there is no evidence against her. Inspector Mattingly and Detective Woodson, who were in charge of the investigation, are now in Brooklyn and elsewhere about \$700 or \$800 worth of silverware and jewelry out of the \$6,000 or \$7,000 worth stolen last spring.

This is the first time since the "Jack the Ripper" robberies that any stolen goods of any amount have been recovered in the Washington territory.
