Shows Only Eight Point Advance in Manhattan and Bronx.

NINE IN KINGS COUNTY

Assessed Valuations Fail to Justify Excuses for Soaring Rentals.

\$8,626,121,707 IN REALTY

Personal Property Put at \$296,506,185, Decrease of \$66,000,000.

The tax rate for 1920 for the city of New York, according to announcement yesterday by Comptroller Charles L. Craig, will be as follows in the five boroughs:

Manhattan, 2.40; The Bronx, 2.45; Kings, 2.45; Queens, 2.43; Richmond, 2.55, or an increase over 1919 of eight points in Manhattan and The Bronx.
