

NO FIELD RICHES FOR PEGGY MARSH'S BOY

Chicago Judge in Decision Says 'Pride in Name' Figured in Merchant's Will.

'LEGAL ISSUE' MENTIONED

Family Admitted Parentage of Child in Marshall Field 3d's Trust Fund.

Special to THE SUN AND NEW YORK HERALD. CHICAGO, March 13. — "The evident pride" of Marshall Field in his name was cited today by Superior Court Judge Denis E. Sullivan, in a decision in which he held that Henry Anthony Marsh, natural son of Henry Field and Peggy Marsh, former chorus girl, now in London, England, could not inherit the money set aside in trust for Henry Field and his "lawful issue."

"The will shows an evident pride in the perpetuation of the name of Field," the finding reads, "and this could scarcely be considered consistent with the evident intent to have the name and the bulk of this fortune linked, and at the same time a fund be created for the support of children who could not legally bear the name of Field."

The decision ends one phase of the litigation in behalf of the Marsh boy for a share in the Field millions. The case hinged upon the terms "issue" and "legal issue" of the grandchildren who were to share in the trust fund of \$1,000,000 set aside by the will. The two phrases were used in the will and former Governor Edward F. Dunne, representing the Marsh boy, held that he had a right to share in his father's estate on the ground that Marshall Field, wishing to provide for every contingency, intended to make provision for legitimate as well as legitimate children of his grandchildren.

An interesting phase of the decision is that the question of illegitimate issue of the grandchildren is considered and treated at length. Judge Sullivan speaks of "not only the possible but the prob-

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able delinquencies of these children when they should approach manhood and womanhood, which would make them parents of illegitimate children; but denies that Marshall Field would have provided for children born in "violation of the law."
Judge Sullivan mentions "the feeling of sympathy naturally evoked in any human breast" for the three-year-old child. "But cases must be decided on the law as it exists, and not as any one may think it should be," he declares, in ruling that "Henry Anthony Marsh, the minor, is not in the class of persons contemplated by the testator as heirs of his estate."
The romance of Peggy Marsh and Henry Field was made public through depositions filed by the former chorus girl soon after the death of Henry Field. In them she declared her child to be the son of Henry Field. "This was virtually admitted by the Field family when Marshall Field 3d established a \$100,000 trust fund for her in settlement of a contract made by his brother. A suit is also pending in which Miss Marsh claims for her son a part in the residuary estate of Marshall Field.
