

FLU EPIDEMIC ENTERS TOMBS, HALTS 3 TRIALS

Quarantine Will Force Criminal Courts to Suspend Operations. 1,712 NEW CASES; 131 DIE. Copeland Warns Against Relaxed Vigilance—Sees Increase To-day.

The influenza epidemic spread in the Tombs prison yesterday. Three trials in the Court of General Sessions had to be postponed because prisoners or witnesses were ill. Fifty-one of the 300 prisoners and six keepers have been taken to Bellevue Hospital. Although there was a decided drop in the number of cases officially reported to the Department of Health, Commissioner Copeland saw no reason to believe the epidemic is abating.

RAIDS PLANNED ALONG U. S. TO CLEAR UP DRY LID

A nationwide drive for the strict enforcement of the Federal prohibition law will begin to-morrow. Acting in accordance with plans formulated at Washington, revenue agents will institute a search for such stocks of liquors as may come within the scope of the dry amendment. Official raiding squads are being increased to carry on this task. Special agents are being sworn in on the wholesale plan in all revenue districts and are being coached by old and experienced sleuths in the art of "field work."
