TYNAN'S BOOZ.

LONDON, June 2.—The book written by P. J. P. Tynan, the Captain of the Irish Invincibles, exposing the inside history of the murder of Lord Frederick Cavendish and Thomas Burke, in Phoenix Park, Dublin, in Mar., 1882, is certain to create a great sensation, and will draw a vast deal of denunciations from the accused Farnellites. STOPPING UP HOT HOLES.

A Device to Prevent War Ships from Stealing What Hit by the Enemy.

LONDON, June 2.—A device for stopping up shot holes in war ships, invented by a marine engineer named Douglas, and accepted by the British Government, has been tested by the United States cruiser Chicago. It resembles a rubber tube with a substance which cements to the steel ribs. It is pushed through the hole made by the shot, then it expands and clogs close round the hole, and the water is much less liable to enter.
