ATTORNEY AND RESOLUTIONS.

1st—We congratulate the country on the successful success of the reconstruction policy of Congress as evidenced by the adoption in a majority of States, fairly to rebellion, of Constitutional rights, equal civil and political rights to all; we regard it as the duty of the Government to sustain these Constitutional and prevent the secession of such States from being permitted to a state of anarchy and anarchy rule.

2nd—The guarantee by Congress of equal rights to all loyal men in the South was decided by every consideration of public safety, justice and equity and must be maintained. The question of suffrage in all the loyal States properly belongs to the people of those States.

3rd—We denounce all forms of repudiation of national debts. The national debt is the property of the public, and it is the duty of the Government to pay it. It is not only according to the letter, but the spirit of the law under which it was contracted.

4th—It is due to the labor of the nation that the national debt should be reduced as far as possible. The national debt, contracted as it has for the preservation of the Union, is a national debt, and it should be paid in full, at a reduced rate of interest, than any other debt.

5th—We deplore the untimely death of Abraham Lincoln, and the accession of Andrew Johnson to the Presidential chair, who has acted unbecomingly to people who elected him and the cause he pledged to support. He has usurped legislative and judicial functions, has refused to execute the laws, has used his office to induce other men to violate the laws, has employed his office to render innocent the lives, property, peace, liberty and life of citizens, has violated the Constitution, has dishonored the name of the President of the United States, and has thereby rendered his power every power attempt at reconstruction of the States, namely in rebellion, and the public patronage in an engine of desecration, and has been justly punished for high crimes and misdemeanors and proved guilty thereof by the votes of thirty-two States.

6th—The doctrine of Great Britain and European Powers, that because a man is subject to the laws of the United States as a rebel, he is not authorized by the law of the United States to exercise his rights of citizenship, and imperiled their lives in the service of the country, and the bounties and pensions granted by law for those who have distinguished themselves in the service of the Union, are obligations never to be forgotten by the widows and orphans of the gallant soldiers of the Republic, a sacred legacy bequeathed to the protecting care of the United States.

7th—Of all who were faithful in the trials of the late war, there are none more fitted for honors than the brave soldiers and sailors who endured the hardships of camp and sea, and imperiled their lives in the service of the country, and the bounties and pensions granted by law for those who have distinguished themselves in the service of the Union, are obligations never to be forgotten by the widows and orphans of the gallant soldiers of the Republic, a sacred legacy bequeathed to the protecting care of the United States.

8th—Foreign immigration in the past has done much to the growth and increased resources of this nation—the assimilation of all nations should be fostered by a liberal and just policy.

9th—This Convention declares its sympathy with all oppressed people who are struggling for rights.

10th—That the adjournment of this convention shall not work a dissolution of the party, but it shall remain as organized, and to be called together at any time, and that the Republican Executive Committee designate.

11th—That we highly commend the magnanimity and forgiveness with which men who have served the rebellion and re-noun frankly and honestly co-operate with the United States in restoring the Union, and that we are in favor of the removal of the disabilities and restrictions imposed upon the late rebels in the measure as the spirit of disloyalty is eradicated from them, and as speedily as may be consistent with the safety of the loyal people.

12th—That we recognize the great principles laid down in the Declaration of Independence as the true foundation of our government, and we hail with every effort towards making these principles a living reality on every inch of our soil.

ALL PERSONS LIABLE TO PAY STATE AND County Taxes for the year 1868, are hereby notified that the Annual Poll-Tax of FOUR DOLLARS for the use of the State and County due from each male resident of this State over twenty-one and under sixty years of age,

IS NOW DUE AND PAYABLE
—TO THE—
County Assessor or his Deputy,
and all are expected to pay said tax when called upon; and, also, that the tax on personal property of persons who do not own real estate within the County of sufficient value to secure the taxes on both their real and personal property, are due and payable when the same are assessed. Under the laws of this State no person is allowed to have his name registered as a voter until he shall have first paid the Annual Poll-Tax due as above in this State.

The laws provided for the collection of the above mentioned taxes will be strictly enforced.
