NOT RIGHT, BY ANY MEANS.—There is a story about a German gentleman, in Berks county, who buried his wife and married again in about ten days. The young men of the neighborhood determined to signify their disapproval of such a breach of propriety as this speedy marriage; so, while the wedding feast was in progress at the house, they called and gave the parties a calumnious sarsaparilla. After a while the groom appeared at the front door, and when silence had been obtained, he said, in a deprecating tone: "I say, boys, you ought to be ashamed of yourselves for making all this noise over a funeral here so soon. It ain't right." The band then adjourned.

The press in Vienna, which is very important and influential, is largely worked, owned, written and influenced by Jews. In Vienna there are fewer Jews than crossed the Jordan with Joshua, and in the Austrian Empire there are as many Jews as there were in Judea at the time of Titus. The Jews of Europe play a most important part in music, in money-making and in politics. They have taken possession of much of the goods in Europe without striking a blow in battle or sustaining the burdens of national life. If ever there was a race specially favored by Providence, it is the Jewish race, for it is the wealthiest, most courted and most influential in Europe.

On Sunday evening Mrs. Redding, wife of A. P. Redding, of Brighton, and mother of Hon. B. L. Redding, died at Jones' Hotel, Summit Valley, of congestion of the lungs. Mrs. Redding left this city about three weeks ago, in good health, with a party of her grand-children. She was taken sick on Friday last, and her husband and Dr. Hatch at once proceeded to Summit Valley and attended her closely until Sunday evening, when she died. She deceased was aged 69 years, 11 months and 25 days.—(Sacramento Record.)

The popularity of our Alms House is well illustrated by the fact that within its walls are now accumulated 303 paupers. Add this number circulating on California street since the fall in stocks, and we find that our pauper population represents no small proportion of the community. The City and County Hospital is even more in favor. At the beginning of the current week there were 521 patients receiving professional attendance, 52 having been admitted last week, and 49 discharged—40 cured, 14 by request, 7 died, and 1 sent to the Insane Asylum.—(S. F. Call.)

The Supreme Court of Illinois has of late delivered several important opinions on the law affecting railroads and telegraphs. It has just decided the oft-debated question as to "lay-over checks." The decision of Chief Justice Walker is to the effect that the check must be used within the period of time prescribed by the company, or it is not available, thus differing from the ordinary ticket, which is good until ridden out, ordinary specifications to the contrary notwithstanding.

SPREADING OF THE GREAT SIERRA TUNNEL IN COLORADO, the Black Hawk Journal says: The map of the line of the tunnel shows that in a distance of two miles from the cover thirty-six known veins will be cut at depths varying from 200 to 1,900 feet. The Boltail will be cut at a depth of 834 feet, which is about 400 feet lower than the Boltail Tunnel cut. It cuts the Gregory 775 feet below the surface, there being a depression at that point.

CHARLES E. PRABSON has filed a petition in the United States District Court, San Francisco, to declare the Woodville Gold and Silver Mining Company bankrupt, alleging that the company is indebted to him in the sum of \$3,000. Since the petition was filed the company has consented to an adjudication.

PROF. HAYDEN, in charge of the geological surveying expedition in Colorado writes to a friend in Washington, under date of the 17th of July, stating that surveys had been completed east of the Rocky Mountains. The expedition has remeasured Pike's, Long's, Gray's and Lincoln's peaks, and found many inaccuracies in previous measurements.

EUGENIA JOR's wife declined to go back to the Polar regions, and was left in New London. Both she and her husband are entirely satisfied with temperate latitudes, and will settle as peaceful fishermen and wife in Massachusetts when the former gets back.

THEY are complaining in one of the interior counties of New York of illness brought upon several persons recently present at a wedding party in the daytime, by their being kept in a close room and almost suffocated in order that, through the aid of artificial light, the occasion might seem more "brilliant."
