ORDINANCE NO. 54.

An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 53, entitled "An Ordinance to Regulate Licenses in Carson City."

The Board of Trustees of Carson City do ordain:

SECTION 1. Section 3 of Ordinance No. 53 is hereby amended to read as follows: Section 3. Any person, firm or corporation whose duty it shall be under the requirements of this Ordinance to take out a license, who shall fail to do so at the time required, shall pay as a penalty of such delay ten per cent. additional to the original amount, and shall be liable to a civil action for the recovery thereof, with costs; and to a criminal action, wherein, on conviction, he, she or they shall be fined not exceeding fifty dollars in United States gold coin, and shall pay the costs of the action, for which costs and fine execution may be issued as in civil cases; or shall be imprisoned in the city jail not more than ten days, or punished by both such fine and imprisonment, as the Court shall adjudge.
