

THE MUNICIPAL ELECTION.

An attempt is being made to stir up trouble over the municipal election. It would give a good many people unbounded satisfaction if Mr. Harris would publish an article which clearly defined his views upon the subject.

Here is the exhibit for 1880, as shown by the bills allowed by the Board:

Table with 2 columns: Month, Amount. January \$1,044, February 1,429, March 1,085, April 1,316, May 652, June 806, July 631, August 936, September 896, October 681, November 1,357, December 1,302.

Total..... \$11,199 This account may be divided as follows:

Police Department—Including pay of police, City Marshal, board of prisoners, supplies, etc., \$350 per month, \$4,200 per year.

Fire Department—Including water, expenses of three engine companies, repairs, etc., \$200 per month, \$2,400 per year.

Street Department—Inspector's salary, repairs, hauling, labor, etc., \$200 per month, or \$2,400 a year.

This accounts for \$9,000, leaving the balance of \$2,199 for sundries.

The above figures are for the year 1880, and show that the expenses have been reduced 25 per cent. by the present system of running the city government.
