### DISCUSSION OF CHURCH UNITY.

The Congregational ministers of Chicago voted the other day, with practical unanimity against a resolution expressing the hope that no discussion of the "tainted money" issue will be encouraged or permitted.

This was the right, wise and sound action to take on the resolution.

Honest and earnest discussion of any moral issue cannot be harmful, nor, in the long run, productive of discord and division. Discussion reveals differences. It is true, but nothing is ever gained by suppression of opinions and the cying of harmony where it does not actually exist. It is fair and tolerant and candid discussion which, in fact, tends to harmony through solutions of problems in accordance with the best judgment of the majority. Discussion may not dissipate all differences of opinion, but the settlement of a question in the light of the fullest and most searching consideration of its pros and cons leaves no personal grievances and no ranking wounds where both or all sides accept loyally in advance the decision of the majority.

The rejection by the Congregational Board of Resolutions relating to the tainted money controversy would not end it. It would be continued outside, and with more vigor and animation than before. Existing divisions would be accentuated and deepened, with consequences that might prove really harmful to the permanent welfare of the church.

It has been nobly said that no question is ever settled until it is settled right—except by accident—unless it has been thoroughly and honestly discussed and light has been thrown upon it from every rational point of view. Free discussion is in truth the right preservative of all other rights, the essential condition of the progress of truth and reason and justice.

The following Associated Press dispatch would seem to indicate that the "tainted money" question is settled so far as the American Board of Missions is concerned. Most people had settled it the same way long ago:

"By a vote of 46 to 10 the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions, sitting at Seattle, went on record as being opposed to a further discussion of 'tainted money' in any of its phases.

"This vote was not taken, however, until the question had been threshed out in all its sides, and the leading Congregationalists of America had voiced their sentiments on the subject.

"Dr. Washington Gladden, the leader of the minority, precipitated the discussion by the introduction of a resolution to the effect that the officers of the Board should neither invite nor solicit donations to its funds from persons whose gains are generally believed to have been made by methods morally indefensible or socially injurious.

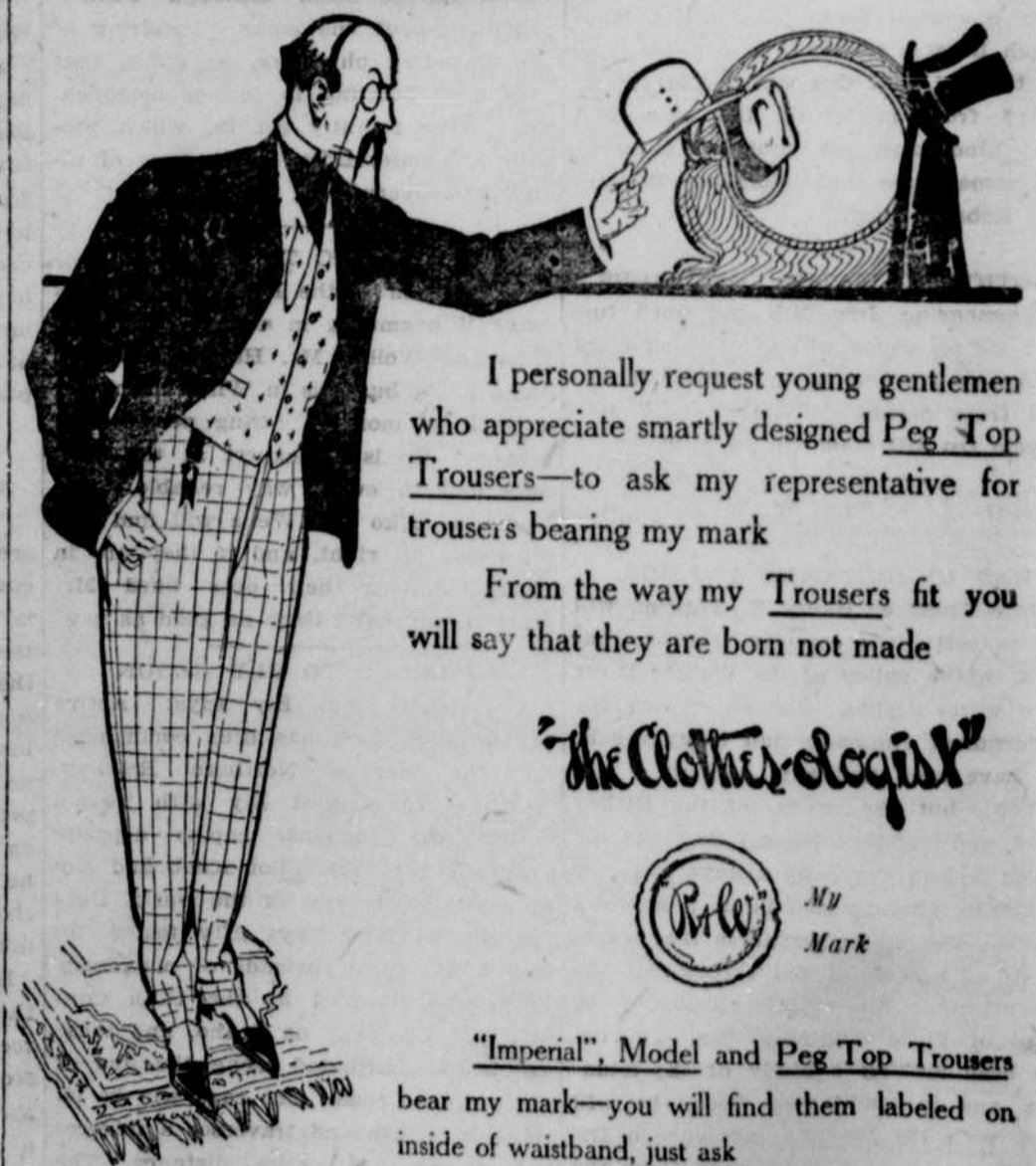
