STATE UNIVERSITY TROUBLE.

Constable Wilson of Reno will visit the University this week and arrest in the neighborhood of thirty-five young collegians. He charged them with assault and battery on William Barrett, a freshman in the college, and the accused men will appear at the Justice court when warrants are served to answer to the charge. They have employed Attorney Lewers to defend them and will fight the case against them. They will probably allege that only a few of the boys assisted in throwing young Barrett into the irrigating ditch.

Barrett claims that his tormentors ruined a \$35 suit of clothes and a pair of shoes by throwing him in the ditch. He demanded that he be paid for these clothes and shoes and the hazers agreed to put up the price, according to the value of the wearing apparel, but refused to pay \$30, claiming that the suit was not worth that much. His mother then swore to the complaint charging the junior, senior and sophomore boys of the University with assault and battery on her son.

The University men claim that they will be proven innocent and will appear to face the charge.

BOARD OF EQUALIZATION.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the County Assessor of Humboldt County, Nevada, has completed the tax list or assessment roll for the year A. D. 1905, and has duly attached his certificate thereto and delivered it and the map, books and all original lists of property given to him, to the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners; that the Board of County Commissioners will meet on Monday, September 18th, 1905, as a Board of Equalization and will hear and determine all complaints made in regard to the assessed value of any property within said county, and will change and correct the valuation, either by adding thereto or deducting therefrom, if they deem the same fixed in the assessment roll either above or below the true value, whether the said sum was fixed by the owner or Assessor; except that in cases where the person complaining of the assessment has refused to give the Assessor his list under oath as required by law. In such cases no reduction will be made by the Board of Equalization in the assessment made by the Assessor. The Assessment Roll will be kept open for public inspection at the Clerk's office until after the adjournment of the Board of Equalization. The Board of Equalization will continue in session from time to time until the business of equalization is disposed of, but said Board will not sit after the first Monday in October, 1905, except that the Board of Equalization will meet to equalize the Assessment Roll and hear complaints in excepted cases mentioned in Sec. 23, Statutes of 1891.
