The directors of the Florence Goldfield mining company at a recent meeting declared a dividend of 10 cents a share, payable January 2, 1908. This means the distribution of \$105,000 to the stockholders of that mine.

Mrs. Belle Dormer, the Tonopah booster, has opened up the first brokerage office in Rawhide and is doing a rushing business. She is one of Nevada's most energetic ladies, and has made both money and success in the brokerage business.—Rawhide Rustler.

A Lincoln county rancher struck an artesian well the other day and applied to Controller Eggers for the bounty offered by the State for artesian wells. Instead of drawing the warrant, the Controller referred the matter to Attorney General Stoddard and he has rendered an opinion that the law authorizing the bounty is unconstitutional. As a consequence the Lincoln rancher will get no bounty for his artesian well.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT ON THE 21st day of October, 1907, in accordance with Section 25, Chapter 3713, of the Statutes of 1907, one Charles H. Snow of Battle Mountain, County of Lander, and State of Nevada, made application to the State Engineer of Nevada for permission to appropriate the public waters of the State of Nevada. Such appropriation is to be made from two springs called Mountain springs in the S W 1/4 of N W 1/4, Sec 19, T. 22 N., R. 44 E., at points at the springs by means of pipes, and 20 cubic feet per second is to be conveyed to points about one mile northerly from spring by means of pipes, and there used for mining and milling at Golden Era mines.
