INTELLIGENCE.

Evacuated.

BORDEAUX, Dec. 30. ... evacuated by the French before the Prussian advance. The French are under orders of Generals Bressoler, Brenns and Garibaldi from Bordeaux. This army is to march direct upon Paris.

The smaller towns now resist as in the case of Tours.

Prussians Repulsed.

At Argent and Coy the Prussians were repulsed by the inhabitants.

BESANCON, Dec. 29.

The Prussians assaulted Belfort again but were repulsed with loss. In the assault on the 21st they had fifty wagons of wounded, who, upon their arrival at Chateauis, were nearly all frozen dead.

Versailles authorities accuse the French of paying 750 francs for each officer escaping and breaking parole.

To Be Attacked.

CARLSRUHE, Dec. 30. An attack will be made immediately by the Prussians with shot and shell, upon Bellville, Vilette and St. Antone. Nothing will be done by the army of the Loire for a fortnight.

Reinforcements to the number of 150,000 men are arriving to join the army of the Loire.

A Paris correspondent of the 29th says shells have been thrown into the north portion of the city from St. Aus, at a range of 7,000 yards.

DOMESTIC NEWS.

WASHINGTON, December 31.

In an interview, yesterday, Minister Schenck expressed an opinion in regard to the fishing question. He said: "My impression is, that Britain is not half so difficult to deal with relative to the fisheries as the Canadians themselves. The latter's conduct is not stimulated by instructions from England; on the contrary it causes much concern to Great Britain herself." He thinks there will be something more than dollars and cents required in the settling of the Alabama claims—such as the reopening of the St. Lawrence and the same rights for American fishermen as for Canadians.

President Grant expresses confidence in the passage of the San Domingo resolution by the House. It is said that the President has already decided upon the names of commissioners, but, declines to make them public at present.
