CHICAGO, Aug. 5.—The residents of the Pacific States held a meeting at the Metropolitan Hotel, New York, on Thursday last, and appointed the following delegates to the Philadelphia Convention:

CINCINNATI, Aug. 6.—Cholera has assumed an epidemic form since the 1st instant, and sixty-four deaths are reported. Yesterday the number of deaths reached 24, and the cases now occurring are malignant, the weather being cool and unfavorable. Thermometer this morning marked 64 degrees.

NEW YORK, Aug. 6.—Money continues easy, gold firmer, stocks dull, and 2 20s of original issue in demand. Bank statements show increase in loans \$196,000; decrease in specie \$232,000; increased circulation, \$96,000; decreased deposits, \$426,000; decreased legal tenders, \$470,000.

Twenty cases and four deaths from cholera occurred in the city, and eight cases and one death in Brooklyn are reported at noon to-day.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 6.—The statement published 1st of August shows \$277,500,000 with \$137,000,000 cash in the Treasury, with a deduction of the debt since a year ago is \$24,000,000.
