STAMP DUTIES—STATE OF NEVADA.

Affidavits, five cents. Agreements or appraisement, for each piece of paper on which the same is written, five cts. Assignments or transfer of mortgage, lease, or policy of insurance, the same duty as the original instrument. (See Mortgage, Lease and Insurance.) Any promissory note, whether payable on demand or any time designated, for a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars, five cents.

Banks checks, drafts, or orders at sight or on demand, payable in the State, two cts. Bills of exchange, drawn in but payable out of the State of Nevada, each bill, or set of three or more, must be stamped; for every bill of each set, five cents.

Bills of sale of personal property, five cents. Bonds of executors, administrators, guardians and trustees, are each subject to a stamp duty of one dollar.

Bonds—official—one dollar. Bond—personal—for the payment of money, the same as mortgage. (See Mortgage.) Bond for indemnifying any person for the payment of any sum of money, when the money ultimately recoverable thereon is one thousand dollars or less, fifty cents.

Certificates of deposit, sum not exceeding one hundred dollars, two cents. Certificates of stock in incorporated companies, twenty-five cents.

Certificates of appointments, five cents. Certificates—general—five cents. The Certificates of a qualification or official character of a Justice of the Peace, Commissioner of Deeds, or Notary Public, or other officer, five cents.

Certificates of profit in incorporated company, for a sum not less than ten dollars and not exceeding fifty dollars, ten cents. Exceeding fifty and not exceeding one thousand, twenty-five cents.

Notary Public, five cents. Powers of attorney to sell or transfer stock, or collect dividends thereon, twenty-five cents. Powers of attorney to vote at election of incorporated company, ten cents.

DO HEREBY APPOINT Thursday, November 29th, A.D. 1866, As a day of PUBLIC THANKSGIVING, and earnestly request the people, so far as practicable, to refrain from their usual avocations, and assemble in the various places of public worship, through out the State.

Let this be a day of profound gratitude to the "Giver of every good and perfect gift," for the manifold blessings of the year. This is in keeping with the request of the Chief Magistrate of the Nation—made to elicit the united prayers and thanksgiving of the entire people of our beloved Union.

Not a few were a people without special reasons for thus assembling together: We have been richly blessed with health, the development of our mining, agricultural and other resources, foretells an increasing prosperity; and as a State, we are, as ever, true to National Unity, and the essential rights of Humanity.
