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Secretary of State's Report. Secretary of State Howell has our thanks for a copy of his report. It contains a great deal of valuable information and much that ought not to be printed year after year. In the expense of running the combined offices of Secretary of State, Clerk of the Supreme Court and State Librarian, Mr. Howell shows that under the consolidation these offices will cost the taxpayers but \$19,630 in salaries for four years as against \$40,000 under the old system, a saving of \$20,370 during the present term. He also shows that the expense of running these offices outside of the salaries has been materially reduced during the past two years.

and Means. Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 2, Sumnerfield, of Washoe—Made special order for tomorrow at 2 p. m. Adjourned at 2:30.

ASSEMBLY. Assembly called to order at 11 o'clock by Speaker Allen. Quorum present. Prayer by the chaplain. Journal of yesterday read and approved.

The committee on Public Morals reported a substitute for A B No. 8, relating to glove contests with the recommendation that the substitute bill do pass.

Ways and Means recommended that bill No. 7 for the relief of H. C. Cutting pass.

A communication from the Asylum was read, inviting the Assembly to visit the institution and partake of its hospitality.

Storey Delegation—No 17—To copy journal of eighteenth session. Referred to Ways and Means.

The substitute for A B No. 8, provided that the license shall be raised from \$250 as provided in the original bill to \$1000, \$100 to go to the county and \$900 to the State. Moved to adopt committee report. Carried with but one vote against. Moved and carried to consider substitute amendment to bill and read third time.

A B No 8 (glove contest) passed by a vote of 20 to 9, one not voting.

AFTERNOON SESSION. Assembly called to order by Speaker Allen.

Roll call, quorum present. A bill regarding game law introduced by Mr. Hatch provides a close season for sage hen. Referred back to committee.

The House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole to consider Assembly Bill No 7, to provide relief for H. C. Cutting to the amount of \$2800 as ex-officio Curator of the State Museum.

Committee arose and reported the bill back to the house favorably. The bill was passed by a vote of 22 to 7. Adjourned.

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
