"We talked about the weather, sports, motorcycles and philosophy. Just before leaving, I asked him to return to the faith," said Father Reilly, "and the following Sunday he came to Mass and received the sacraments."

Two days later a phone call from a police sergeant in Nara: Nakajima, on his motorcycle, had just collided with a truck. He was killed instantly.

On Submarine TV Program

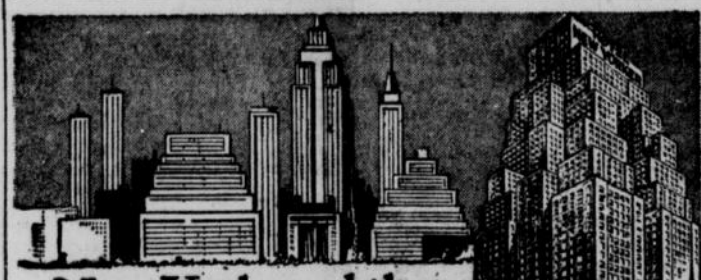

Cardinal's Hat Raised to Ceiling

CHICAGO, Ill.—(NC)—The red hat of the late Cardinal Samuel Stritch was raised to the ceiling of Holy Name Cathedral here to hang there until it disintegrates.

This traditional practice was followed by a Pontifical Mass to mark the expiration of one month since the death of Cardinal Stritch in Rome. Celebrant of the Mass was Archbishop William D. O'Brien, Auxiliary of Chicago.

The hat itself is low-crowned, with a one-foot brim. In modern times it is used only twice, when the cardinal is elevated to that rank and when the hat is placed at the foot of the cardinal's casket at death.

President Refuses OK On Kerala Bill

KOTTAYAM (AIF) — Following the advisory opinion of the Supreme Court, the President of India has refused assent to the Kerala Education Bill 1957. The Bill passed by the Communist government of Kerala state violates several fundamental rights guaranteed in the Indian Constitution to minorities.

Kerala is a state on the west coastline of India.

The action of the President is a great victory for the Christians and Muslims of India in general and of Kerala in particular who conducted a very vigorous and non-violent agitation against the Bill until it was passed by the Communist-dominated legislature on September 2, 1957. Later on, they conducted a very costly litigation against the Bill when it was referred by the President of India to the Supreme Court for its verdict.

It was the pressure which was brought on the President by the Christians and the Muslims that induced him to refer the Bill for the opinion of the Supreme Court—an unprecedented instance in the 10-year history of the Indian Republic.

The rejection of the Bill is undoubtedly a great victory for the democratic and the anti-Communist forces in Kerala, especially for the Catholics who led the fight against the Bill throughout and who would have felt the adverse effects of the same more poignantly than the rest if it were enforced.
