out to the poor villages in teams, several in each team, with a professor as their guide. Some live in a Christian community organizing Christian life.

Others live among pagans, In the most difficult circumstances praying and working for conversions. For five hours each day the seminarians teach catechism to both groups. In many instances whole villages are received into the Church.

Inasmuch as all the seminarians are native, the people no longer fear Christianity as a Western religion. Inasmuch as these seminarians live in conditions than those they teach, the poor people are immediately convinced of their sincerity and love. Inasmuch as many of them are helping the poor in areas where the Communists destroyed property and life, there is an immediate recognition of the superiority of Christianity.

The difficulty is that about 50 per cent of all the seminarians who apply for admission in our mission seminaries are turned away because there are no funds to educate them. 


