'Strike' on the M. & C. R. R.

The M. & C. railroad seems to be in serious trouble again with its employees. Since the 1st day of January, we learn that no trains have been running on the Chillicothe and Marietta branch of the road, in consequence of which there has been but one train a day on the Hillsboro branch.

In extension of the delay in payment, it is said that the company has suffered severely from the financial pressure, by which its business has been greatly diminished for the last few months. Added to this, it has lost a large share of business by the recent rupture with the Baltimore & Ohio railroad, resulting in the loss of its running connection with that road.

The people on the line of the road will be put to great loss and inconvenience by the stoppage of the trains, and we hope the company will soon be able to get out of its difficulties, and resume operations.

We find the following paragraph in reference to our branch of the road, in the Cincinnati Commercial of Monday:

The mail train on the Marietta and Cincinnati road arrived on time on Saturday evening, and will leave at the regular hour this morning. Temporary disturbances on the road may prevent its going farther east than Athens. The accommodation train has not been running to Chillicothe since Thursday, but has not yet been interrupted between Hillsboro, and this city.

General Washington Flooded.—The following actual incident in Washington's life is taken from Collins' Historical Sketches of Kentucky: 'Col. Davall's paternal ancestor accompanied Lord Fairfax from England when he came over to colonize his grant in Virginia. At the time General Washington was stationed in Alexandria as a Colonel of a British regiment, before the war of the Revolution, an altercation took place in the court-house yard between him and William Payne in which Payne knocked Washington down—Great excitement prevailed, as Payne was known to be firm, and stood high, and Washington was beloved by all.—A night's reflection, however, satisfied Washington that he was the aggressor, and in the morning, like a true and magnanimous hero, he sought an interview with Payne, which resulted in an apology from Washington and a warm and lasting friendship between the two, founded on mutual esteem. During the Revolutionary war, while Washington was on a visit to his family, Mr. Payne with this Davall went to pay his respects to the great American chief. Washington met him some distance from the house, took him by the hand and led him to the presence of Mr. Washington, to whom he introduced Payne as follows: 'My dear, here is the little man whom you have so frequently heard the speak of who once had the courage to knock me down in the court-house yard at Alexandria, big as I am.''

Washington's Flourish.—The only instance we ever met with where General Washington deliberately tried to 'flourish,' is related by a writer in the N. Y. George Clinton, under date of March 27, 1783. It announces to the Governor the conclusion of the Peace. The signature stands out from the paper as freshly as if it were written, not seventy years ago, but yesterday.—Go, Washington!' The letter is only a dozen lines; it announces the fact that peace between the United States and Great Britain has been concluded—'on which glorious event,' Washington writes: 'Permit me to congratulate you with the greatest sincerity.'
