DECORATION DAY

Oration of Governor Hunt at Hillsboro, May 30, 1882.

We are to-day in the presence of the living and the dead. These quiet graves speak to our souls with an eloquence more powerful than the words of any man. They tell us of the valor and the sacrifice of our fathers, and of the peace and the prosperity of our country. We are reminded of the duty which we owe to our country, and of the responsibility which we bear for the future of our race.

The uprising of the American people in the spring of 1861 was the most dramatic and wonderful event in this or any other nation. At that time, to a common observer, the military spirit of the masses had become almost extinct. We had nothing that could properly be called a standing army, and the body of soldiers known as the army of the United States amounted to only about sixteen thousand men. The navy was insignificant, and the coast was open to the enemy.

The rebellion of 1861 was the most dramatic and wonderful event in this or any other nation. At that time, to a common observer, the military spirit of the masses had become almost extinct.
