Prescribing the duties of the Auditor and Treasurer of the State relative to the receipt, safe keeping and disbursement of Public Money, and accounting therefor.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Ohio, That the Auditor and Treasurer of the State shall be the principal accounting officers of the State...

receipt, disbursement, deposit or custody of the moneys of the State, or any part thereof, and shall carefully count all the moneys remaining in the treasury...

SECTION 14. To enable the Auditor to make the examinations required by this act, the Treasurer shall on the demand of the Auditor submit to his full and unrestricted examination, all the books, accounts, vouchers, certificates of deposit...

SECTION 15. It shall be the duty of the Auditor, whenever requested by the Auditor, to appoint some competent and suitable person to assist him in making such examination...

SECTION 16. All the material facts ascertained by the examinations prescribed by this act, shall immediately be reported to the Auditor, who shall have the same before the general assembly...

SECTION 17. If from any such examination or from any other satisfactory evidence, the Auditor shall ascertain that the State shall have suffered any damages, or shall be in immediate danger of any injury or damage...

SECTION 18. It shall be the duty of the Auditor or quarter annually on the 15th day of March, June, September and December...

SECTION 19. Whenever the term of office of any Treasurer shall have expired, or he shall have resigned, died, or have been removed from office...
