Knox Co. People Have The Controlling Stock, It Is Said

MEANS NEW FACTORY

Stockholders To Decide Upon New Buildings At Meeting In January

Announcement was made Thursday morning that all the stock in the Williams Hydraulic Clutch Co. had been sold, and that a majority of the stock would be held by Mt. Vernon and Knox county people.

This means that the new buildings of the company will be constructed in Mt. Vernon.

It was stated that the stockholders, at their annual meeting in January, will decide upon the construction of the new factory buildings. This means another substantial industry for Mt. Vernon, employing quite a large number of men.

CANNELL GIVES HOUSING ADVICE

Rubber Co. Official Big Aid To Committee

TENTATIVE PLANS MADE

Survey, Finance, Real Estate And Business, Divisions Of Work

Many valuable suggestions were given the housing committee of the Chamber of Commerce at its meeting Wednesday afternoon by Mr. E. Scott Cannell, vice-president of the Knox Tire & Rubber Co. and a prominent real-estate dealer of Cleveland.

Organization plans were largely discussed at the meeting.

In general, it is planned that the committee's work shall be divided into four parts—survey, finance, real estate and business. The committee is sufficiently large to admit of this division.

A careful and accurate survey of the situation will be made to ascertain the number of houses which will be needed. The results will be based upon concrete evidence. The matter of forming a corporation to handle finances will next be taken up. Then a decision must be reached on how to build, whether by plain or cost-plus contract, and, finally, a site or sites must be obtained.

Chairman Frank E. Kirby expects to announce shortly the division of work in his committee.

TEACHERS OF COUNTY TO MEET NOV. 9TH

Quarterly Institute Will Be Held In Mt. Vernon On That Date

FORMER NOBILITY SUES GOVERNMENT

(By Associated Press to The Banner) CASSEL, Germany, Oct. 15.—Two Germans, formerly of the nobility, who have been deprived of the new regime of the greater part of their estates, have been obliged to sue the new government for restoration or reimbursement. They are the Prince of Waldeck and Pyrmont and the Duke of Coburg-Gotha.

The former principality of Waldeck and Pyrmont is now governed by the Diet in Arolsen where the Prince owned before the revolution two castles and a vast domain of forest. After vainly offering to buy these from him, the Diet confiscated all the Prince's property promising to pay him what the courts should determine to be a fair price.

By one stroke of the pen the commissioners who now rule the new Free State of Gotha, confiscated the property of the Duke of Coburg-Gotha estimated to be worth 65,000,000 marks and this without offer of remuneration. The commissioners who were Spartacists took forcible possession of the ducal buildings, estates and bank accounts and, in 24 hours, the Duke was stripped of everything he owned.

The other portion of the duchy, Coburg-Gotha, has reached a financial agreement with the Duke.

Both Prince and Duke have sued the new governments. In the case of the Duke, the court which sits in Gotha has obtained a legal ruling from government attorneys that confiscation without remuneration is illegal, so that the Duke is likely to recover his money or be paid for his property. After all, life, for Dukes, Princes and other nobility in Germany today is unhappy.
