INCREASE OF 50 CENTS A DAY.

San Francisco.—The threatened strike of the unions affiliated with the Pacific Coast Maritime Builders' Council was averted when the unions voted to accept the compromise offer from the Master Shipwrights' Association of \$4.50 per day on all work, which is an increase of 50 cents a day over the old scale. Some weeks ago the unions asked for \$5 per day on new work. This was refused by the employers, who offered \$4.50 per day, but demanded that the unions eliminate the clause in the agreement restricting the number of apprentices. This was rejected by the unions. When the union men met to take a strike vote the employers submitted another offer of \$4.50 per day and consented to keep in the agreement the section restricting the number of apprentices. This agreement was accepted by the unions. The men will continue to receive \$4.50 per day on old work and will at once get the increase of 50 cents a day on new work. About 700 men are affected by the wage increase.

STOGIE MAKERS STRIKE.

Bellaire, Ohio.—About 300 stogie makers employed in fifteen factories in Bethesda, the stogie town about twenty miles west of here, are on strike. The stogie makers there are composed of boys, girls, women and men, and have never been organized. Recently they had a get-together movement and demanded an increase of twenty-five cents on the 1,000 stogies. This was refused by the manufacturers and the strike resulted, it being the first strike ever to occur in that town. Just what the outcome of the strike will be cannot be foretold. However, there is a possibility that the stogie makers will affiliate themselves with the recognized union, in which case they are bound to win out. Among others, the 'Sterling Big Havanas,' which the local Stogie Makers' union is fighting because of their being non-union, are made in Bethesda. The Sterling factory employees are out with the others.

Cleveland, Ohio.—Officials of the railway brotherhoods today pointed to the recent annual statements of railroads today as 'showing clearly that the railroads are well able to pay the increased wages resulting from the Adamson law.'
