225,000 U. S. STEEL MEN GET 10 PER CENT RAISE.

New York.—Wage increases of about 10 per cent for 225,000 employees, adding nearly \$30,000,000 to its annual payroll and making a total increase of 43 per cent since February, 1916, were announced recently by the United States Steel Corporation. ELEVATOR MEN OF CITY HALL TO WALK OUT

Eight Thousand Municipal Employees Now on Strike; Council Committee to Consider Action—Repair Work on Pumping Stations Held Up; Engineers Also Complain of Conditions.

Chicago.—Elevator men employed in the City Hall today will join the strike of 8,000 building trades workmen. Their grievance is that non-union men are running elevators.

All union officials will meet at 365 West Madison Street today to figure on how many men are out and whether all who came under the strike order had been instructed to stop work.

The finance committee of the City Council is expected to take up the strike today at the same time the sanitary teamsters' controversy is considered.

Stationary engineers and firemen will determine whether they will strike. They complain that their members have been discharged and laborers at a lower rate of wages put in their places.

Repair work at a number of pumping stations is practically at a standstill. Bricklayers and carpenters remained at work at the Central Park Pumping Station, while 140 men quit at the Mayfair Pumping Station. All who have not quit are expected to today.

"No sanitary teamster will return to work, as ordered by the city officials," said Andrew A. McGregor, business agent of the union. "The notice was received by our members last week. We have a meeting with the finance committee before the City Council.
