

MARLBORO IS PUZZLED OVER A MURDER

Suspicious Circumstances Over the Death of Aaron Hollibaugh, a Prominent Farmer.

Mark on Head Found Which Indicated That a Death-Dealing Blow Had Been Struck.

Within sight and sound of his home, where his wife was anxiously awaiting his return, Aaron Hollibaugh, a wealthy farmer of near Marlboro, met with a mysterious death Sunday afternoon. The entire village is aroused and the mystery is being discussed in every house there.

Mr. Hollibaugh left the house at about 4 o'clock Sunday afternoon presumably to bring the cows from the pasture on the other side of his farm. Two hours passed with no signs of his return and his wife became anxious. Thinking that he might have gone to the home of his nephew, which is only an eighth of a mile away, she went there to search for him.

A search was instituted and the farm was thoroughly gone over before any signs of the missing man were found. The party finally came upon his body, which was lying in the rear of the orchard near the house.

He went to the scene of the death Monday morning and made a thorough examination of the situation. A search was made over the orchard and fields surrounding the place where Hollibaugh's body was found and a picket from a nearby fence was discovered which fitted the mark on the side of the dead man's face exactly.

Coroner Schiltz made a post-mortem examination which showed that the blow was not heavy enough to have caused death under ordinary circumstances but that death might have resulted from the excitement incident to the attack, if there was an attack made.

Today Prosecutor R. H. Day was notified of the affair. As soon as possible a thorough investigation of the affair will be made by the county authorities. They are not certain as to the cause of the death and until that is settled nothing definite can be done.
