For Representative to General Assembly

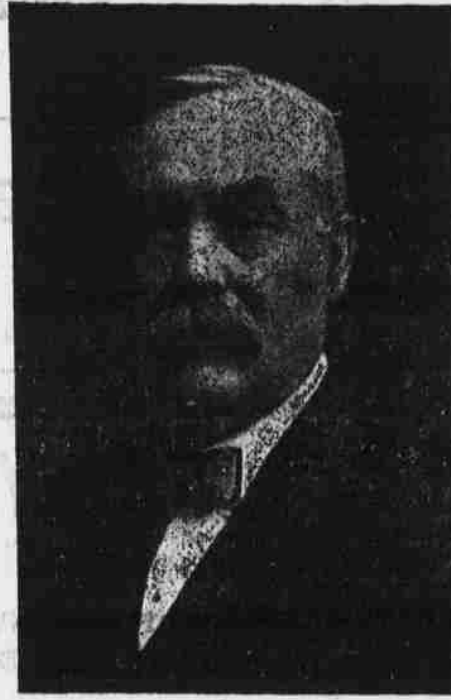
