Pekin, April 15—After many vexatious delays the \$50,000,000 loan agreement for the establishment of a uniform currency system in China was signed today. American, French, English and German financial groups are behind the loan, which was first negotiated by an American syndicate made up of J. P. Morgan & Company, Kuhn, Loeb & Company, the National bank and the First National bank of New York. Part of the money will be expended in the development of Manchuria. The banks involved will be given six months to approve the scheme.

BRANSON HOME SCENE OF RAID

Police Search House For Intoxicating Liquors.

MRS. HARVEY UNSUCCESSFUL

Pleads For Husband to Return to Her.

Mrs. Branson of Grant Avenue Will Be Charged With Keeping a Place Where Intoxicating Liquors Are Kept For Sale—Mrs. Harvey Is Unsuccessful in Her Attempt to Take Husband Back Home.

About 10:30 Friday night, the police were informed that it was the opportune moment to raid the home of Mrs. A. Branson colored, of Grant street as quite a number of people were making merry within the dwelling. Accordingly Captain Bond, Officers Jones and Powell hastened to the scene of the festivities and searched the house.

On the inside the officers found a number of Marion's citizens, both white and black. They also discovered one full case of beer, an empty case of the same beverage and some whiskey.

An affidavit was filed for the arrest of Mrs. Branson, charging her with keeping a place where intoxicating liquors are kept for sale as a beverage. Although the house is a private dwelling it is said that the evidence will show that it is a place of public resort. Mrs. Branson has married but does not live with her husband.

Mrs. Frank Harvey, of Cleveland, who has been spending the last few days in the city, attempting to induce her husband to return to Cleveland and live with her did not depart for her home yesterday noon, when she started for the Union depot. She returned to the police station and renewed her efforts to obtain an interview with her husband with such persistency that she was successful.

Paying all expenses she hired a livery rig and persuading Officer Jones to accompany her, she drove to the home of E. Russell north of the city and by resorting to strategy of some sort, drove back triumphantly with her husband in tow.

At the police station, Harvey would not allow Chief Klinefelter to leave him alone as he feared his wife would throw poison in his eyes. He claims that she has attempted to poison him a number of times. Harvey is a sickly looking man, while his wife seems smart, dressy and trimly dressed.

Mrs. Harvey pleaded with her husband the entire afternoon. About 5:30 o'clock, Chief Klinefelter grew tired of the jangling and ordered them out of the station. Harvey boarded a six o'clock car for his home in the country. It is said that Mrs. Harvey decided that her trip to Marion was made in vain and returned to Cleveland.

LAST CORPS COMMANDER TO BE HONOR GUEST AT WAR SURVIVORS' DINNER



GENERAL DANIEL E. SICKLES

New York, April 15.—One of the first semi-centennial celebrations of civil war events will be at the dinner at Hotel Bector April 21 for the survivors of the Twelfth New York regiment, at which the guest of honor will be the venerable General Daniel E. Sickles, the last surviving corps commander of the federal army.

The Twelfth regiment marched away toward the front April 21, 1861, just six days after President Lincoln issued his call for 75,000 volunteers. It participated in many battles. There are about 100 survivors, nearly half of whom live in this city. Officers of the present Twelfth regiment, national guard of New York, successor to the wartime organization will attend the dinner and fraternize with the veterans.

General Sickles, who is a graduate of the old West Point, is in his eighty-sixth year. He lives on Fifth avenue. The general commanded the Third army corps at Gettysburg, where he lost his right leg. In 1857 the congressional medal of honor was conferred upon General Sickles "for most distinguished gallantry in action at Gettysburg, July 2, 1863, displayed on the field of battle before and after the loss of his leg while commanding the Third army corps."
