

McDOUGAL FILES APPEAL IN CASE

APULPA MAN, DEPOSED AS ESTATE MAN GUARDIAN, WILL CARRY CASE HIGHER.

CLAIMS LINN IN ERROR

Shows Where His Debt to Estate Was Fully Protected and Legal—New Men The Bond.

That Judge D. A. McDougall of Sapulpa, who was removed last week by County Judge Fern Linn as guardian of the estate of Lester Pittman, Jr., a wealthy Indian minor, will fight the new to a finish was indicated yesterday by Judge McDougall when he filed a motion to appeal here. Yesterday \$20,000 bond, deputy county attorney, John E. Jones, who formerly officiated with Judge Linn, who was appointed as joint guardians to succeed McDougall, succeeded in making the \$20,000 bond required of them by the court and probably will at once take charge of the estate, unless the order of the court is superseded by Judge McDougall.

"The findings of Judge Linn," said Judge McDougall, "are contrary to the evidence in the case. Of all the many charges made against me by Attorney Davidson and Williams the only one the court sustained was that I was indebted to the estate

\$9,500. When I was first appointed guardian of the estate I owed the estate \$2,000 and this I still owe, fully protected. Later I purchased a piece of property on which the estate held a mortgage of \$4,500. This the court finds that I have divested. How it could be divested is more than I know, as I personally assumed the \$4,500 mortgage held by the estate and this mortgage has never been cancelled and is in full force and effect.

"My books have always been open for inspection. An auditor appointed by the court went over them and every penny was accounted for."

SAM LANGFORD LOST TO GUNBOAT SMITH

CALIFORNIAN GOT DECISION AT THE END OF TWELVE ROUNDS

DECISION WAS UNPOPULAR

Langford Did Not Try in the Early Rounds, But Had Better of the Closing Rounds.

BOSTON, Nov. 17.—Gumbel Smith of New York, was given the decision over Sam Langford of Boston, at the end of a 12-round bout here tonight.

Smith led clearly during the early rounds, scoring repeatedly on left jabs to Langford's head and body while the Boston negro made no serious attempts at defense. But as the bout went on Smith, the California heavyweight, worried, and Langford assumed the aggressive, sending right and left to Smith's body at short range, while the latter swung unhesitatingly at Langford's head. So many and so strong were Langford's blows in the closing rounds that many of the spectators expressed surprise at the decision of Referee Dick Flemming.

Smith at the start jabbed away with his left, supplying nearly all the action. Langford did not seem to be bothered by long range blows, turning away many without great effort and standing up under others without defense. Occasionally he interjected a right or left on Smith's body but not until the seventh round did he make any apparent attempt to reach the battle. Then Langford started a short range fight which in the eighth round resulted in opening Smith's cheek under the left eye.

Smith, by reputation a strong right hand fighter, relied on his left jab throughout. Several attempts to land right swishes met with varying success, but his jabs were continuous.

MRS. BESSIE KENNEDY ARRESTED ON CHARGE OF FLEEING LOCAL JEWELRYMAN.

HUSBAND WAS A SUICIDE

Woman Caught Shoplifting a Few Days Ago, but Officers Permitted Her to go Free.

After a search of several months, the county officers have succeeded in arresting Mrs. Bessie Kennedy, charged with fleeing from Mrs. Kennedy, a woman of good appearance, several months ago, got several hundred dollars worth of diamonds from a local jeweler and disappeared before the officers could locate her. Sunday she was seen on the street by an officer, recognized and arrested. Her case will probably be taken before the grand jury.

Mrs. Kennedy went to a local jeweler and secured the diamonds, after giving satisfactory references, intending, she said, to show them to some parties who wanted to buy. She never came back, but went to Fort Smith where she is supposed to have pawned the diamonds.

Last week, Mrs. Kennedy was caught shoplifting in a local jewelry store. She had been looking over some pins and when she left the store, a \$25 pin was gone. The police were notified and she was arrested in a pawnshop and the pin recovered. The jeweler did not prosecute and she was released at that time.

Mrs. Kennedy's husband committed suicide at a rooming house in this city last September, by taking his life in a rooming house. His wife nursed him several days, but he died.

MORTGAGES ARE NON-TAXABLE

Judge Says State Not Liable to New Law.

OKLAHOMA CITY, Okla., Nov. 17.—District Judge W. R. Taylor Friday afternoon rendered a decision, wherein he held that mortgages securing loans made by the state school land department are not subject to the tax rate specified by the last legislature as a substitute for the law repealed. The decision was given in an action brought by the state to compel Register of Deeds Cornelius of Oklahoma county to record a mortgage given to the school land department upon the payment of the custom recording fees. The county official contended that the state was liable for the tax as are individuals. It is understood the case will be appealed to the supreme court as a test case for final decision.
