**A VISIONARY SCHEME.**

Governor Waite, of Colorado, who gave himself a notorious reputation by declaring for "blood to the brides," is again before the public announcing that the free coinage of silver shall be the law of his state. He states officially that arrangements have been made whereby he will coin for the state, independent of the national government, all the silver product of Colorado. In speaking of the scheme, the Fort Worth Mail has this to say:

Governor Waite's scheme to have Colorado silver coined in Mexico, the coin to bear the Mexican and the Colorado coat of arms, is a desperate makeshift of the mine owners to unload a depreciated metal on their own people that cannot win. It would have nothing but a bullion value, and it is hardly probable that even a Colorado bank would accept it as anything but bullion. Even should the scheme materialize, the only thing that it would really show would be the actual difference between a good and a bad dollar.

PRESIDENT CLEVELAND, the patriot and statesman, concludes his message to congress in unmistakable language which shows his position toward the masses. He says: "In conclusion, my intense feeling of responsibility impels me to invoke for the manifold interest of a numerous and confiding people the most scrupulous care, and to pledge my willing support to every legislative effort for the advancement of the greatness and prosperity of our beloved country."
