ANNOUNCEMENTS OUT FOR SUMMER SCHOOLS

Six Weeks Courses Will Be Given to Enable Students to Make up Back Work Classes to Begin Monday.

CLASSES TO BEGIN MONDAY

Sessions Will Be Held in Several Buildings From 9 to 12:30 Each Morning.

There will be a regular summer school for pupils living in the city, to enable them to make up back work, and for those who are weak in certain subjects. For the most part the work will be conducted on the departmental plan, and will continue six weeks, beginning Monday, June 10.

The hours will be from 9 to 12:30 each day. The school is designed especially for those who have lost time on account of sickness or on account of being in half-day school. The board of education has planned to conduct this school free to the students in order that they might not suffer any disadvantages because of the irregularities during the past year at times when schools were discontinued on account of lack of fuel or half-day sessions because of lack of building accommodations.
