

USED AIRPLANE IN CATCHING CRIMINAL

Fleeing Negro Captured at Dewey During Hot Chase Through Use of Bartlesville Craft.

For once an airplane has been of some real service in something besides military or mail service. It might be suggested that the county officials would do well to buy one to aid in locating escaped criminals.

Charley Anderson, the Bartlesville United States marshal who yesterday brought C. D. Purlett to Tulsa on a draft evading charge, said that the negro who killed City Marshal Mull of Dewey on last Sunday was located by the use of one of the Bartlesville planes in charge of Billy Parker.

Anderson says that Mull and the city clerk of Dewey went to arrest the negro for beating his wife and that the black seemed peaceable enough until Mull went to leave the house with the negro following. It was then that the shot was fired into Mull. The negro then paraded the streets of the black portion of town threatening anyone who interfered with him and escaped out into a cornfield at the edge of town.

It was then that the airplane was brought into use and the man located. Mr. Anderson says that fully a thousand people gathered around the jail at Bartlesville that night and that the negro had to be spirited away in order to avoid more mob violence than had already taken place at Dewey.
