JUDGMENT RENDERED ON NOTE WRONGLY DATED

Judgment was rendered in superior court yesterday by Judge A. A. Brockbridge against W. J. Baber, E. W. Machen, J. T. Johns, J. A. Tilley and Lee Kunsman in favor of C. H. Overton on a note for \$200, 1914, and due in 90 days.

Later, it seems, it was discovered through a clerical error, the note was dated a year ahead of time, so the defendants refused to pay it.

Judgment as rendered allows Mr. Overton the face of the note plus the interest at 8 per cent from 30 days after date of December 19, 1914.

OKLAHOMANS WILL GIVE NEARLY TWO MILLIONS

With the last details of the fourth Liberty Loan not yet out of the way, the united war work campaign is almost upon us.

Each W. M. C. A. is to have a meeting with a special representative who is to have direct charge of raising the fund in the district of which Tulsa is a part Monday, when definite plans will be made and announced.

Oklahoma is asked to give the sum of \$1,700,000 to be divided between the national war work council of the Y. M. C. A., the war work council of the Y. W. C. A., the national catholic war council (Knights of Columbus) the Jewish welfare board, the war camp community service, the American library association and Salvation army.

It is the largest amount yet asked for the purpose of carrying on the work of the above named organizations, but the state district chairman are most optimistic over the outcome.
