WEATHER PROPHET GETS BUSY

Prof. Garret Scents the Approach of Two Big Storms.

Washington, Sept. 24—Two great storms are moving toward the east from opposite directions. Prof. Garret of the weather bureau said today that when they meet there will be a general fall of rain in the middle and eastern states. One of the disturbances is another West Indian hurricane which was reported to the weather bureau this morning to be off the west end of the island of Cuba. The other is a rain storm now prevailing in the northwest. The hurricane is moving northward and the northwest storm is moving southward, so that in the natural order of things they are expected to meet and considerable damage is likely to result. The West Indian hurricane is expected to reach the gulf coast tomorrow or Wednesday.

CONSTITUTIONAL CAMPAIGN

Fight Between Two Big Parties Will Be Vigorous One

Oklahoma City, Sept. 24—The constitutional convention campaign is warming up and in the course of a few weeks will be on in full blast. Conventions for the purpose of naming candidates for delegates are being held today in the Enid and Purcell districts, the former by Republicans and the latter by Democrats. The Democrats of the Twentieth district will convene at Marana tomorrow. Both the Democrats and Socialist of the nineteenth district will meet at Ripley on Friday, and the Democrats of the Forty-seventh district will hold their convention on Saturday. The Republicans of this city and of this district will convene on October 12. These will be about the last of the important conventions. Candidates have already been named in many districts, a few of which were selected at non-partisan mass meetings.

THE SOUTH'S IMPERIAL STAPLE.

Over \$2,000,000,000 is invested in cotton mills in Europe and America dependent upon the south for their raw material. It is estimated that 10,000,000 people in Great Britain alone live on the cotton industry of that country. The balance of trade in favor of the United States depends upon our cotton exports, which now annually reach 400,000,000, or more than the world's gold production. Of this royal crop, imperial in magnitude and in domination of the world's financial and manufacturing interest, the south holds a world-monopoly. Its ability to increase cotton production, are limited only by its labor supply. Economic forces will of necessity bring about a great increase in population and thus prepare the way for a vast expansion in manufacturing and in production as the price and demand may justify. The south produces 80 per cent. of the cotton for the 119,000,000 spindles in the world, but has less than 10,000,000 spindles itself. Think of the limitless possibilities for expansion in this industry alone when you are studying the future of the South. —Manufacturers Record.
