Elsewhere in this paper we publish the report of a meeting and society formed in Wagoner, I. T., to promote a work before congress for statehood of the two territories of Oklahoma and the Indian. It is the only feasible plan and the only one congress will listen to, if it listens to any. We are well aware of a strong prejudice existing against a union of the two, but when the condition exists here in this territory, and the strong probability that Oklahoma will make a strong effort for admission this winter, and may succeed, and further that eastern congressmen are and will be opposed to admitting another state of the Indian territory afterward, we can afford to give way to our prejudices and take the matter as we can get it.

Should Oklahoma be admitted as a state this winter the Indian territory is likely to be attached to Oklahoma in pieces hereafter. There is no use to argue that such a thing would be outrageous and no government would do such a wrong. You have only to look at what congress has done for the Indian Territory in the past, and you can easily forecast the future. It is time for the Indian territory to look after its interest. Oklahoma is going into congress boot and spurred for nation and statehood is likely to fall to her lot and the hope of the Indian territory will be in the dim future.

The affairs of this territory, as allotment, townships, etc., can be as easily and readily adjusted under statehood as it can under the chaotic condition, now existing.

The Wagoner movement should meet the approval and support of every community in the territory, if not by all the people, by at least as many as are anxious and willing to get from under the existing circumstances. Has Chickasha enough supporters of the movement to get up a meeting?

It is not a political question, but one that affects all, republicans, democrats and poos.
