Mayor's Proclamation.

Mayor's Office, Chickasha, Indian Territory, December 4th, 1900.

Whereas, the term of two of the city school directors will expire on December 15th, 1900, the term for which they were elected, and also the resignation of another member of the board having been accepted to take effect on same date, Therefore, I, the undersigned, Mayor of the city of Chickasha, I. T., by virtue of the authority in me vested by law do hereby proclaim, and direct, that there shall be an election held in the City of Chickasha on the 15th day of December, 1900, at the different wards hereinafter designated, for the purpose of electing one director to fill the unexpired term of N. M. Williams, resigned, and two directors to serve for three years.

Said election to be held in wards No's. 1, 2, 3, and 4 and at the following named polling places: Ward No. 1, H. B. Johnson's barn; ward No. 2, at the grocery store, known as the Berry wood yard; ward No. 3, U. S. Court House; ward No. 4, at A. B. Snow's lumber yard office.
