## THE RESERVE.

Kiowa and Comanche  
Opening to Include  
the Wichita Res-  
ervation.

## FLYNN GAINS HIS POINT

Three Counties May Be  
Built From These Three  
Reservations—Will  
Rush Allotment.

## APPROPRIATION BILL

Charley Curtis Completes the Indian  
Appropriation Bill—Hitchcock  
Is Ready to Hasten Work  
Since Flynn Had an  
Interview With  
Congressmen

Washington, Dec. 16.—By virtue of an understanding with Joseph Cannon, chairman of the house committee on appropriations, Delegate Flynn today offered an amendment to the urgent deficiency bill which the committee will report providing for an appropriation of \$65,000 for completing the allotment in the Kiowa and Comanche reservations; in addition thereto, Mr. Flynn will shortly introduce a measure looking to the adjustment of matters relating to the Wichita reservation and providing for the preliminary steps to throw it open to settlement. In this connection an important conference took place Saturday between Flynn and Secretary Hitchcock as a result of which the interior department today forwarded instructions to proceed with the work of allotting the lands of the Wichita reservation, which was interrupted by the attorneys of the Chickasaw and Choctaw Indians to acquire

possession of what was claimed as their right to the reservation, decided against these Indians by the supreme court last Monday. The money to make these allotments was appropriated some time ago, and was put in reserve fund as soon as the work was suspended for the above named reason. The secretary is in a position to go ahead with the work without delay. The aim now is to have the reservation ready for settlement on the same day that the Kiowa and Comanche reservation will be thrown open, and the department feels confident that it can have everything in readiness by that time.

This will probably not be later than August 8, next.

In accordance with his understanding with the secretary, Delegate Flynn will shortly introduce a bill dividing the county lines, etc., and providing for at least one land office in the Wichita reservation. The plan which will probably be pursued is to blend the Wichita and Kiowa and Comanche reservations by merging a section of each into one county and forming a two additional counties out of what will be left of the Kiowa and Comanche reservations. The Indian appropriation bill has been completed by the subcommittee, headed by Mr. Curtis of Kansas, and today was submitted. It is understood that it carries a little short of \$7,000,000.

## The Non Payment of Taxes.

South McAlester, I. T., Dec. 14.—Captain J. W. Ellis, Captain of the United States Indian Police has received orders from the Secretary of the Interior for the removal of thirty persons from the Choctaw and Chickasaw nations for nonpayment of tribal tax, after the issuance of the decision of the Attorney General that these taxes must be paid.
