

REPUBLICANS OF TULSA ORGANIZE

Party Club Began Life With 30—Today Has Over 600 Members.

NEXT MEETING 26TH

President Lingo Urges All Club Members to Swell Rolls to 2,000.

Tulsa has a strong active republican club. The wave of public sentiment favoring the restoration of the republican party to power, which has been steadily gaining in momentum since the congressional elections in November, 1918, until it swept away a year later the opposition even in the democratic fifth district has aroused the enthusiasm of local republicans to a pitch never reached before.

Nowhere is that enthusiasm more apparent than in the Tulsa republican club organized on last June 25 with less than 30 members; it has now grown in membership until its rolls contain more than 600 men and women of the city.

Within the next month if the present rate of increase is maintained the membership will exceed several thousand, according to the predictions of E. O. Lingo, president, and Wayne L. Dickey, secretary. Every republican in the city will be enrolled as soon as possible, the officers say, and campaigns for members will also be conducted throughout the county.

Financially the club is on a firm basis. Prominent men of the city have been so generous in their donations to the organization that no regular membership fee is assessed the membership at large. Donations received have been large enough to keep the organization clear of all indebtedness and also maintain permanent clubrooms and headquarters on the second floor of the Drew building.

Many Leaders Congratulate Club.

Immediately after its organization the club received a letter of congratulations and endorsement from Will H. Hays, chairman of the republican national committee. Its files contain letters of encouragement from such men as Senators Lodge, Root, Borah, and George Lockwood, the National Republican Weekly.

Being the strongest republican club in the state the club was well represented at the recent convention of republican clubs held at Oklahoma city under the auspices of the Roosevelt club there. John R. Hadley, third vice president of the local club, was elected president of the Oklahoma federation of republican clubs formed at the convention.

While under the constitution of the organization it is restrained from taking any part in a contest between two republican candidates for an office, it is planning to make itself an important factor in the outcome of the coming elections. Steps are already being taken that will enable the club to do effective work in conjunction with the city, county, state and national republican committees in the coming campaigns.

On November 26 the club will hold

its next regular meeting in the club headquarters. At that time nominations will be made for the election of officers to be held on the first Wednesday in December.

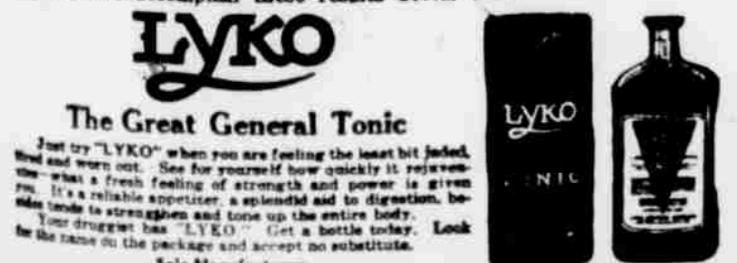


Youthful in Body and Mind
