Gentlemen:—Replying to yours of recent date, beg to advise I have a dairy containing 360 cows and have tried all kinds of feed, but have found nothing to give the results that cotton seed meal and hulls will. If you remember about one year ago I commenced feeding cotton seed meal and hulls and the first ten (10) days my increase in butter and milk was about 10 per cent; after feeding thirty (30) days my increase was about 20 per cent and has been holding its own ever since, besides decreasing my expenses about sixty (\$60.00) dollars per month on other feed.
